Prayer and Liturgy

Pentecost Sunday

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John 14:15-16, 23-26

Jesus said to his disciples:

"If you love me, you will obey my commandments. I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Helper, who will stay with you forever. Those who love me will obey my teaching. My Father will love them, and my Father and I will come to them and live with them. Those who do not love me do not obey my teaching. And the teaching you have heard is not mine, but comes from the Father, who sent me. I have told you this while I am still with you. The Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything and make you remember all that I have.

Today is the feast of Pentecost. We remember that Jesus sent the Holy Spirit to be with his disciples. Pentecost means 50 in Greek as the Holy Spirit came to the disciples 50 days after Easter. What do you remember from today's reading?

This passage is part of the last conversations Jesus has with his disciples before he dies and so he is preparing them to live without his leadership. Jesus tells the disciples that if they love him, they will do as he has asked them. What has Jesus asked the disciples to do?

Jesus asked them to love one another as he has loved them. And he says that God will send the Holy Spirit to be with them forever and to help them. The Holy Spirit will teach the disciples everything they need to know once Jesus has left and will remind them of Jesus' words while he was with them.

Jesus also says that if we love him, his Father will love us and live with us. What do you think this means?

In some versions of this gospel story Jesus says that God will "make a home" in anyone who listens to his word. Do you think God will live in our house with us, sleep in the spare room and sit down with us to eat dinner like a guest? Maybe not, but God lives with us in our hearts. God is always there and the Holy Spirit is always guiding us to do what is right. How do you think we can make sure that we are welcoming God into our lives? (By listening to his word, loving God and other people etc.)

This week let's remember that God is always with us and try to listen to God's words to us. Let us be guided by the Holy Spirit, who was given to the disciples on the first Pentecost and is still with us today, to show our love for God and for other people.

How will you show your love for God in the coming week? How will you show your love for others?

Ever-loving God, send us your Spirit, give us your courage, so that we may follow you and love you all the days of our lives. Let us share this love with others throughout the world. Amen.
