Keeping Our Children Safe Online: A Message for **Parents**

In today's digital world, social media plays a huge role in how children connect and communicate. While platforms like Snapchat can seem like harmless fun, it's important for parents to be aware of the potential risks—especially when children use these apps before reaching the recommended age.

Age Restrictions and Why They Matter Many parents may not realize that apps like Snapchat, Instagram, and TikTok have age restrictions of 13 and above. These limits exist for good reason: social media platforms expose children to unfiltered content, online strangers, and peer pressure in ways that can be difficult for them to navigate.

The Risks of Snapchat Groups

While Snapchat allows children to chat with friends, private group chats can sometimes become spaces where inappropriate conversations, cyberbullying, or even dangerous challenges take place. Unlike traditional messaging apps, messages on Snapchat disappear quickly, making it harder for parents to monitor what's being shared.


Additionally, Snapchat's location-sharing feature (Snap Map) can make children vulnerable to privacy risks, allowing others to see their movements in real time.

How Parents Can Keep Their Children Safe Know the age limits – Ensure your child is using age-appropriate apps.

Talk openly – Discuss the risks of social media, encourage responsible use, and make sure they know how to seek help if needed.

Monitor usage – Check privacy settings and guide children on how to report harmful content. Promote positive online habits – Encourage kindness, respect, and critical thinking about what they share.

By staying informed and engaged in our children's online lives, we can help them navigate the digital world safely and responsibly. 

Attendance and Punctuality

It is important that your child is on time for school each day, so that they can benefit from a full day's education.

A reminder that holidays during school time are not authorised whatever the circumstances and a local authority fine will be issued. If you do take your child on holiday, please inform us before you go as it could become a safeguarding issue if we cannot contact you.

Please report any absences before 9.00am via Seesaw or telephone call. If you have any difficulties getting your child to school and especially around lateness please contact Mrs Kelly.

If you are taking your child out of school during the school day, you must show a letter/email/ appointment card. Please do your best to make appointments outside of school hours.



Supervision After School Hours

We would like to remind you of our after-school supervision policy to ensure the safety and well-being of all our students. Please be aware that there is no supervision available for children after the end of the school day. It is important that all children are picked up promptly at the end of their school day. For safety reasons, any child who is not collected by 3:45 PM will be placed in our Night Owls provision. This ensures that all children are supervised in a safe environment until they can be picked up. Please note that there is a £10 charge for this service, which will be billed to parents.

We appreciate your cooperation in ensuring that all children are picked up on time and that our school remains a safe and secure place for everyone.


If you are sharing information regarding collection of a child or appointments they may have, please make sure you select the 'School Office' option as well as your class teacher.

Prayer and Liturgy

The Most Holy Trinity

Today is Trinity Sunday when we think about how God is made up of three persons: God the Father, Jesus Christ the Son and the Holy Spirit.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John 16:12-15

Jesus said to his disciples:

"I have much more to tell you, but now it would be too much for you to bear. When, however, the Spirit comes, who reveals the truth about God, he will lead you into all the truth. He will not speak on his own authority, but he will speak of what he hears and will tell you of things to come. He will give me glory, because he will take what I say and tell it to you. All that my Father has is mine; that is why I said that the Spirit will take what I give him and tell it to you."

This story is part of Jesus' farewell conversation to the disciples before he dies on the cross.

Jesus says to the disciples that after he has gone, the Holy Spirit will guide them. The Holy Spirit will be their teacher and will speak to them just as Jesus did when he was alive and with them. The Holy Spirit will show the disciples what they must do and what they must say in Jesus' name.

Who teaches you and guides you? Teachers, parents, friends and family all teach us and guide us. And the Holy Spirit is there to guide us too.

There is only one God. But God is made up of three persons: the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. This is what we call the Trinity. Trinity means three.

Can you think of a way that we are reminded of the Trinity every time we pray? (Through the Sign of the Cross.)

This relationship of the Father, Son and Spirit is a relationship where all are together but each person is also different. The Father created the world and everything in it and sent his only Son Jesus to live among us here on earth. Jesus came to help us to know the Father, to teach us how to live and to forgive our sins. When he returned to heaven, he sent the Holy Spirit to give us courage, to guide us in the right path and to bring us faith, hope, joy and peace.

This is a bit like our families – we might have parents, sisters and brothers, aunts and uncles, nieces and nephews, cousins and grandparents. Whatever the size of our family, we know there are different people in our family who have different relationships and jobs, but we are still only one family with them. We are all connected through our family bond.

Who do you live with? Do you live with lots of people or just a few? Do all your family live close by or are they spread far apart?

We are also part of one big global family that includes everyone in the world. We are all God's children. We are all special, and even though we are all different, we are all equally important. We are all called to care for one another and for the earth that we live in. But how we do this depends on who we are and our own aifts.

We believe that Jesus' promise to the disciples – that the Holy Spirit would be with them and guide them – is still true for all of us today and for all people after us. The Holy Spirit can guide us to do what is right and to use our talents in the best way to help others.

Can you listen to the Holy Spirit in the coming week, and see how the Spirit guides you, especially in the way you treat those you live with and the members of our global family throughout the world? Let us all do our best this week to listen to and love God the Father, Son and Holy Spirit and try to live as God asks us to.

> Loving God, you are with us always. Send us your Spirit to teach and guide us to live in peace with each other every day. Amen.
