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#### Dear Parents / Carer

At All Saints Catholic Primary School, we are fortunate that the majority of parents and carers appreciate that educating our pupils involves partnership between all of the school community. A good working partnership is important to equip pupils with the necessary skills for adulthood and we welcome and encourage parents and carers to fully participate in the life of our school. Unfortunately, the behaviour of a minority of parents and carers can impact negatively upon the good working partnership. We believe that all school staff, parents, carers and pupils are entitled to a safe and protective environment in which to learn and work. The purpose of this letter is to provide a reminder of the conduct expected from all visitors to our school.

#### **Disruptive behaviour**

For many of us this may come as a surprise, however a third of schoolteachers nationally have suffered abusive behaviour from parents and carers in the past. We firmly believe that all members of the school community have the absolute right to work and be in school without fear of aggression or abusive behaviour from parents and carers. Such behaviour can be through face to face contact, in written communications, on the telephone or by the use of social media and can present a risk to staff and pupils. To support a safe school environment, we cannot tolerate parents, carers or visitors who exhibit any of the following behaviour:

- Use of loud and/or offensive language or display temper
- Threaten to carry out actual bodily harm to any other person on school premises
- Damage/destroy school property
- Intimidate any other person on school premises
- Make vexatious or malicious allegations against a member of the school community, either in writing or via direct contact verbally
- · Insult any member of the school community in an attempt to demean or undermine

The above list is not exhaustive and any individual exhibiting disruptive or unreasonable behaviour will be considered in accordance with the school's Code of Conduct <u>Behaviour Policy Sept</u> <u>24.docx - Google Docs</u>. The school may ultimately decide to impose restrictions on an individual when entering the school premises including a ban from school entirely, which may also extend to non-admittance to school events such as pupil plays/assemblies and communications restricted to writing or via a third party.



# Prayer and Liturgy Feast of Saints Peter and Paul

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew 16:13-19

Jesus went to the territory near the town of Caesarea Philippi, where he asked his disciples, "Who do people say the Son of Man is?"

"Some say John the Baptist," they answered. "Others say Elijah, while others say Jeremiah or some other prophet."

"What about you?" he asked them. "Who do you say I am?"

Simon Peter answered, "You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God."

"Good for you, Simon son of John!" answered Jesus. "For this truth did not come to you from any human being, but it was given to you directly by my Father in heaven. And so I tell you, Peter: you are a rock, and on this rock foundation I will build my church, and not even death will ever be able to overcome it. I will give you the keys of the Kingdom of heaven; what you prohibit on earth will be prohibited in heaven, and what you permit on earth, will be permitted in heaven."

In our gospel, Jesus asks the disciples who people say that he is.

The disciples say that people think Jesus might be John the Baptist, Elijah, Jeremiah or one of the prophets.

Then Jesus asks the disciples who they believe he is. What does Simon say?

Simon says that Jesus is the Son of God. Simon believes in Jesus and he is not afraid to say so.

What does Jesus say and do next to Simon?

Jesus gives Simon a new name – Peter. And Jesus tells Simon Peter that he will have the keys to the kingdom of heaven.

Simon Peter was just an ordinary fisherman with his brother Andrew. But he was one of the first disciples of Jesus.

Jesus gave Simon the name Peter which means 'rock' in Greek. Jesus wanted to build his Church on strong ground and rock is a strong material. Simon Peter's faith was strong here, like a rock, so Peter was a good name for him!

Peter is one of the greatest leaders of the early Church. He believed in Jesus and wanted to follow him and serve him. And in this story Peter also spoke up about what he believed.

What does Simon Peter teach us about knowing Jesus?

What does he teach us about serving Jesus?

Simon Peter is considered to be the first pope. All the popes since then have followed on from Peter. Pope Francis called us to be 'Pilgrims of hope' in this Jubilee Year and our new pope, Pope Leo XIV reminds us that the Church wants always to seek peace and to be "close above all to those who are suffering." How do you think you might do that?

Can you speak up for what you believe in, like Simon Peter, this week? Can you be strong in your faith and show others what you believe?

Christ Jesus,

may our hearts be filled with joy as we honour Simon Peter, our leader and rock in the faith. May we be inspired to be like him, serving others both here and around the world and speaking up for what we believe. Amen.
