

A Gentle Reminder About False Nails

At All Saints, the safety and wellbeing of our children always come first. Recently, we have noticed an increase in pupils wearing false nails, including BIAB, acrylics and similar products. While they may look lovely, they are not in line with our uniform policy and can unfortunately pose a real risk during play and physical activity. We have already had a few incidents where children have caught their nails while running or playing, which has caused painful injuries. To keep everyone safe, we kindly ask that children do not wear any form of false nails in school. Please be aware that if a child is wearing false nails, they will not be able to take part in outdoor play, PE lessons, Swimming, any physical activity or games where the child wearing the nails or others might be injured. We know this may be disappointing for some children, and we truly appreciate your support in helping us keep everyone safe and active. By working together, we can make sure all pupils can enjoy school life without unnecessary risk. Thank you for your understanding and cooperation. It really does make a difference!





WORLD BOOK DAY 2026

Attendance and Punctuality

It is important that your child is on time for school each day, so that they can benefit from a full day's education. A reminder that holidays during school time are not authorised whatever the circumstances and a local authority fine will be issued. If you do take your child on holiday, please inform us before you go as it could become a safeguarding issue if we cannot contact you. Please report any absences before 9.00am via Seesaw or telephone call. If you have any difficulties getting your child to school and especially around lateness please contact Mrs Kelly. If you are taking your child out of school during the school day, you must show a letter/email/appointment card. Please do your best to make appointments outside of school hours.


Absence Reporting – Seesaw

When reporting an absence please make sure you select both the 'Absence Reporting' and 'School Office' options as well as your class teacher. This will ensure the right staff are receiving the information needed and you are not being contacted unnecessarily. If you are sharing information regarding collection of a child or appointments they may have, please make sure you select the 'School Office' option as well as your class teacher. Thank you!

Supervision After School Hours

We would like to remind you of our after-school supervision policy to ensure the safety and well-being of all our students. Please be aware that there is no supervision available for children after the end of the school day. It is important that all children are picked up promptly at the end of their school day.

For safety reasons, any child who is not collected by 3:30pm will be placed in our Night Owls provision. This ensures that all children are supervised in a safe environment until they can be picked up. Please note that there is an £11 charge for this service, which will be billed to parents. We appreciate your cooperation in ensuring that all children are picked up on time and that our school remains a safe and secure place for everyone. Thank you for your understanding and support.



If your child is 30 minutes late every day they miss 2 and a half hours a week. That works out at 4 days a term and 12 days a year!

If your child is between 5 and 16 years old and is a registered pupil at school, it is your legal responsibility to make sure they attend regularly.

If your child misses 1 day of school a week they miss 7 and a half weeks a year. This is more than half a term of learning!

Prayer and Liturgy

Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Jesus tells us today that if we do what is right and good, others will see that we believe and will praise God. We can be an example for others, like a light shining to show the way. Let's think about that light as we listen to the readings.


A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew 5:13-16

"You are like salt for the whole human race. But if salt loses its saltiness, there is no way to make it salty again. It has become worthless, so it is thrown out and people trample on it. "You are like light for the whole world. A city built on a hill cannot be hidden. No one lights a lamp and puts it under a bowl; instead he puts it on the lampstand, where it gives light for everyone in the house. In the same way your light must shine before people, so that they will see the good things you do and praise your Father in heaven."

When it is dark, we switch the light on, like this. What would happen if we cover the light up with something? If we uncover the light we will be able to see much better and it won't be so dark anymore. Just like this. (Uncover the lamp)

In the reading today, Jesus tells us that we are like light to the world. What do you think this means?

We are asked to do good things – to help others and live as God wants us to. In this way, we can let our light shine in people's sight. When they see our good works, they will praise God. Through the things that we do, other people will know how good God is. God loves everybody, no matter where in the world they are from, whether they are rich or poor. God asks us to do the same because we are all members of the same global family. What do you think we can do to show other people that we care about them? If we love other people and do what we can to help them, then other people will see how great God's love is. We will be like the light that shines and is not covered up, so that everyone can see. How will you be like a shining light this week?
