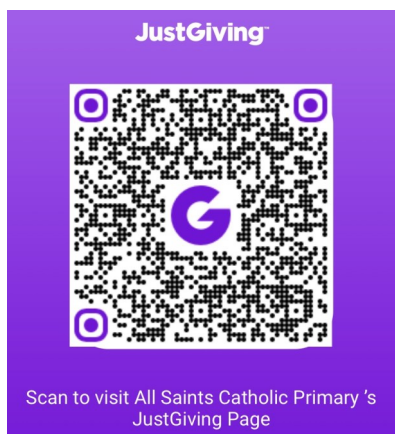

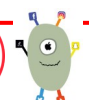

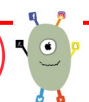

Are you a parent or carer who currently escorts your child/children to and from school each day? Have you ever considered that by dedicating around 40 – 45 minutes of your time twice a day, you could help to make the routes to and from school safer for our school children by helping them to cross the road and be paid whilst doing this?

There is currently a vacancy for a school crossing patrol around your school and the Road Safety Team urgently requires your help to fill this post. We offer the following:

- Up to £14.02 per hour (7 hours a week)
- Full training provided
- Summer and winter uniform provided

Liverpool City Council relies on the local community to come forward and we are now appealing directly for someone who is reliable and conscientious, who would be prepared to take on this rewarding role. You will need to be willing to have a medical and must complete a Disclosure and Barring Service form to authorise a Police check.

Please note that until we are able to recruit someone to this post, there will be no School Crossing Patrol and the site will be uncovered so please take extra care when crossing.

Are you fit, healthy and enjoy meeting people? Would you like to help local pupils and be part of your community?

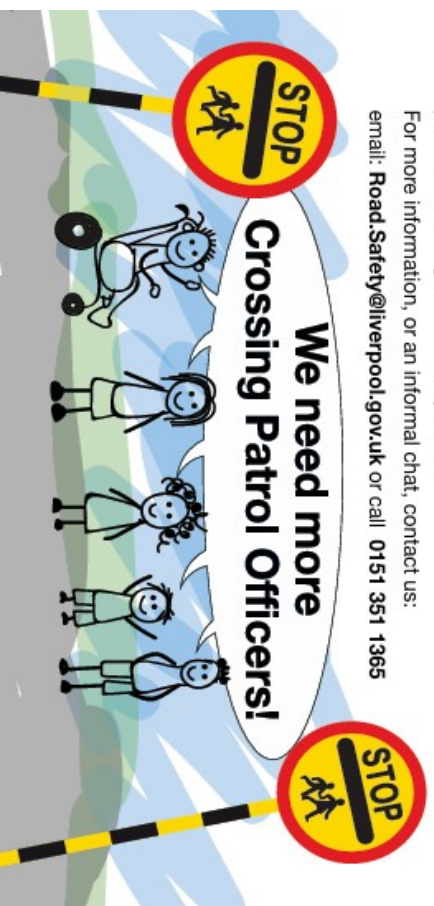
Benefits include:

Successful candidates are required to work 7 hours per week over the 5 day school week, term time only and will need to have a medical assessment, plus a DBS background security check.

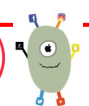

Prayer and Liturgy

Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time

God takes care of us no matter who we are. We are reminded that God is with us in every part of our lives, so we should not be afraid.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew 10:26-33
Jesus said, "So do not be afraid of people. Whatever is now covered up will be uncovered, and every secret will be made known. What I am telling you in the dark you must repeat in broad daylight, and what you have heard in private you must announce from the housetops. Do not be afraid of those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul; rather be afraid of God, who can destroy both body and soul in hell. For only a penny you can buy two sparrows, yet not one sparrow falls to the ground without your Father's consent. As for you, even the hairs of your head have all been counted. So do not be afraid; you are worth much more than many sparrows!

"For those who declare publicly that they belong to me, I will do the same before my Father in heaven. But if anyone rejects me publicly, I will reject him before my Father in heaven."

Jesus' friends are afraid and don't know what to do. They feel that they aren't very important and that God may not look after them.

Jesus looks at the world around him and sees God watching over everything, even tiny birds like sparrows. Have you ever seen sparrows? What do they look like?

When you look at the world, what else can you see that might remind you of God's love for us all?

Jesus tells his friends that they are worth more than many sparrows. If we ever feel afraid, we can remember those sparrows in the gospel, or some of the other things we have mentioned, and be reminded that God loves us even more.

Jesus says that, because God is looking after them, his friends need not be afraid to speak up and tell everybody about Jesus and the things he said.

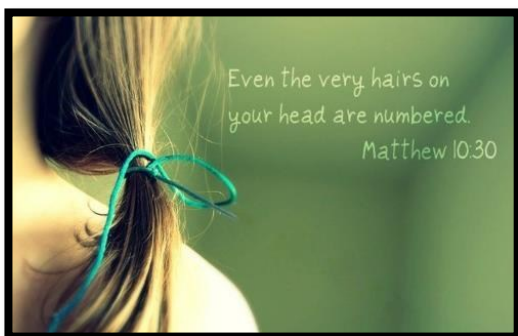
Can you remember some the things Jesus said, that it would be good for us tell other people? He said that we should try to love our neighbours as we love ourselves. Anything else? We all need help sometimes. We cannot do everything on our own.

The local people that CAFOD works with around the world are there helping make sure that the people in their community have the food that they need and the tools and seeds to grow their own. They support people to have clean water, to know their rights and to change their lives for the better.

God loves us all and so we are called to take care of one another, to love one another, no matter where in the world we are. We are also called to protect and care for the earth, so that everyone can share in the good things that God has given us.

This can be hard sometimes. We might need to be brave and speak out for what we know is right when we see others treating people or the earth badly.

Can you try to remember that God loves you this week? Can you be brave and try to share that love with others just like the disciples?

Attendance and Punctuality

It is important that your child is on time for school each day, so that they can benefit from a full day's education. A reminder that holidays during school time are not authorised whatever the circumstances and a local authority fine will be issued. If you do take your child on holiday, please inform us before you go as it could become a safeguarding issue if we cannot contact you. Please report any absences before 9.00am via Seesaw or telephone call. If you have any difficulties getting your child to school and especially around lateness please contact Mrs Kelly. If you are taking your child out of school during the school day, you must show a letter/email/appointment card. Please do your best to make appointments outside of school hours.

Absence Reporting – Seesaw

When reporting an absence please make sure you select both the 'Absence Reporting' and 'School Office' options as well as your class teacher. This will ensure the right staff are receiving the information needed and you are not being contacted unnecessarily. If you are sharing information regarding collection of a child or appointments they may have, please make sure you select the 'School Office' option as well as your class teacher. Thank you!

Supervision After School Hours

We would like to remind you of our after-school supervision policy to ensure the safety and well-being of all our students. Please be aware that there is no supervision available for children after the end of the school day. It is important that all children are picked up promptly at the end of their school day.

For safety reasons, any child who is not collected by 3:30pm will be placed in our Night Owls provision. This ensures that all children are supervised in a safe environment until they can be picked up. Please note that there is an £11 charge for this service, which will be billed to parents. We appreciate your cooperation in ensuring that all children are picked up on time and that our school remains a safe and secure place for everyone. Thank you for your understanding and support.



If your child is **30 minutes** late every day they miss **2 and a half hours** a week. That works out at **4 days** a term and **12 days** a year!

If your child is between 5 and 16 years old and is a registered pupil at school, it is your legal responsibility to make sure they attend regularly.

If your child misses **1 day** of school a week they miss **7 and a half weeks** a year. This is more than half a term of learning!
