Change to the School Day – From September 2026

From September, our school day will be changing.

Mainstream

School gates will continue to open at 8:30am.

Registration will close at 8:45am (currently 9:00am).

Children arriving after this time will receive a late mark.

The school day will finish at 3:15pm for Reception, Key Stage 1, and Key Stage 2.

The Hive

Doors will open at 8:30am.

Registration will take place at 8:45am.

The school day will finish at 2:45pm.

Thank you for your support in helping children arrive on time and ready to learn.

Nursery Provision

There will be no changes to the Nursery provision.

Hours will continue to be 8:00-1:00 and 1:00-6:00.

Why we are extending the school day:

- **DfE guidance:** The Department for Education has advised that all mainstream schools should offer a minimum school week of 32.5 hours. Extending our day would bring us in line with this national expectation.
- **More time to deliver our curriculum:** We want to continue offering a broad, balanced, and ambitious curriculum. Additional time would help us deliver all subjects effectively without reducing the richness of learning experiences.
- **Protecting play and wellbeing:** Lunchtimes are vital for children's social development, emotional wellbeing, and regulation. Rather than shortening this time, extending the school day allows us to protect high-quality play and social opportunities.
- **Equal opportunities for all children:** Schools across the country are making similar changes. Extending the day ensures our pupils receive the same learning time and opportunities as others nationally.
- **More time with teachers:** The additional learning time would give children more opportunities to practise, deepen their understanding, and reach (and exceed) their potential.

Dear Parents/Carers,

We hope this letter finds you well. As we are coming to the end of the year, I know many parents will be looking to buy uniform for September. Wearing a uniform has several benefits, including promoting pride in our school but most of all ensuring a level playing field for all children, especially in this cost of living crisis. With this in mind, we ask that where items of clothing do not come with the school logo, they remain plain and unbranded.

Uniform Expectations:

- Black shoes, **unbranded**
- Grey or black trousers/ shorts/ skirt or pinafore, **unbranded**
- White shirt, **unbranded**
- School tie
- Grey Sweatshirt or cardigan sweatshirt or cardigan (with or without the school logo)
- White or grey socks or grey tights.

PE Kit (to wear on PE days):

- School PE T- shirt and shorts set.

OR

- Plain black T- shirt, **unbranded**. Plain black shorts, **unbranded**
- Optional black or Navy tracksuit bottoms or under armour for outdoor PE, **unbranded**.

Items of Jewellery:

- We allow small stud earrings and analogue watches. Smart watches are **not** allowed. All jewellery must be removed during PE lessons.

Hair & Accessories:

- Hairstyles should be appropriate for a school setting, and long hair should be tied back.
- No brightly coloured hair weaves, extensions or dyed hair.
- No headwear with bold patterns or colours
- Hair accessories should be minimal.

Makeup

It is not appropriate for primary age pupils to wear make-up in school.

Nail polish, nail extensions or false nails are not permitted.
