## Message from the Headteacher

#### **Dear Families**

As you will be aware from previous communications, the next two days of strike action for the NEU (largest teaching union) will be taking place on Wednesday 15th and Thursday 16th March. There are some changes to the arrangements on this occasion and a separate letter will be sent to families detailing the arrangements so please look out for that in your inbox.

It was a pleasure to see so many parents attending the Year 8 Parents' Evening (either virtually or in person) this week. There was a really positive feeling and parents commented on the "lovely buzz" that the face to face event creates. The flexibility of the hybrid model is working really well and we are seeing higher attendance figures as a result.

We are looking forward to our next INSET day on Monday. The day is focused on key areas of our school improvement priorities and includes sessions on aspects of SEND, whole school behaviour management systems and the development of a range of teaching and learning approaches.

# Who to Contact

The relationship between school and home is a key one as a successful partnership between us will support your child's learning, progress and happiness at school. Our aim is to work with you and your child to ensure that happens, which is why it's important to talk with us if you have any questions, concerns or wish to share information with us. Our reception staff will be able to direct you to the right member of staff but, as a general guide, the key routes for contact are as follows:

- > For most pastoral matters, your child's tutor will be the first point of contact;
- > If the matter remains unresolved, or for more complex pastoral matters, please ask for your child's Head of Year;
- For matters relating to lessons and learning in a single lesson, please contact your child's teacher in the first instance;
- > If the matter remains unresolved or is more complex, please ask for the Head of Faculty in that subject area;
- For other matters, please describe your situation to our reception staff and they will direct you to the appropriate member of staff.

Please remember that many of our staff are also teachers which means that they will not be able to make immediate responses due to their teaching commitments. We aim to respond to all queries within 2 working days; for more complex queries this initial contact may be a holding response whilst we look into your concerns. If your concern is more urgent, please explain that when you make contact.

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#### From the Safeguarding Team

#### Wellbeing

Please find <u>here</u> a letter from Somerset County Council about a wellbeing survey that schools are asked to carry out. Students will be given time to complete the survey by the end of May and we will report the outcomes to you once they have been sent to us. This is part of a much larger programme about wellbeing which will include a series of lessons that students will be part of, a tutorial programme during the month of June, extra curricular activities, workshops in Year 7 and a parents' information evening for all year groups about Emotion Coaching to help support children at home. #### PACE – Parents Against Child Exploitation

We have a representative from Escapelines, a charity committed to the prevention of child exploitation across the South West coming into school to speak with parents and answer any questions you may have about this topic. Here you can see the parent pack that they have provided in advance. This will take place on <u>Tuesday 28th March at 5.30pm – 6.30pm in PA2</u>. We are looking forward to seeing as many of you as possible. County Lines and Child Exploitation are something that all parents need to be aware of so they recognise the signs and intervene should their child be affected by this. Both the police and Escapelines emphasise that any child can be drawn into this no matter their background or upbringing so want to be able to inform all parents of what to look out for. We very much hope that our students do not come into contact with any of these issues but are conscious that by informing students, staff and parents we may be able to spot any concerns as soon as possible and intervene immediately.

#### From Mr Mitchell, Assistant Headteacher: Community and Conduct

#### **Learning Behaviour Focus**

Our fantastic student council team were tasked to identify a core value which the entire academy would promote, practise and be rewarded for when seen and carried out. This 1/2 term kindness was chosen and we are thrilled to see how many acts of kindness are carried out across the Academy every day. Having explored ideas for how students could show this within lessons, more and more are being rewarded for actions which demonstrate a genuine willingness to support staff, their peers and the wider community.

#### Mufti Days

Thanks again to our student council team who have coordinated and selected a series of charities to raise funds for. We have opted to split our days to support national events, but also local charities who operate within our immediate area, including an event for Cary Cares in May. Our first fundraising MUFTI day is on **FRIDAY 17th March**, raising funds for Comic Relief Pupils are welcome to wear their own clothes [ideally one item being RED]. We ask for a donation of approximately £1 which can be paid online via School Gateway in advance or with cash on the day.

#### **Student Tour Guides**

A team of outstanding Year 9 and 10 pupils, nominated by staff, have undertaken a training package to become student tour guide ambassadors. These students play a vital role in recruitment events and helping to manage events where guest speakers and other visitors are working at the academy. Student ambassadors aim to represent our ethos and explain to guests the functionality of different areas within the academy.

#### Year 10 Prefect Applications

We are thrilled to announce that the window for senior and subject prefects is now open. Ms Mallord addressed the year group in assembly on Wednesday to talk about what for many young people is an excellent opportunity to show and develop their leadership and management capabilities. #### Somerset County Council

#### Somerset Food Champion

As part of our partnership work with Food for Life/Soil Association, the Zing Service of Public Health, Somerset County Council, is launching the Somerset Food Champion Network training, see details attached.

The training offers practical cooking sessions to encourage and enable healthier eating choices with the cost-of-living-crisis in mind. Adopting a train-the-trainer approach, participants are offered training and support as Food Champions to promote the importance of low-cost, nutritious (nutritionally balanced) and seasonal food for healthier eating. The Network serves as a platform for ongoing support and co-learning through collective reflection and sharing of knowledge and best practices.

#### What is the role of a Somerset Food Champion?

A Food Champion passes on food knowledge and practical skills in group settings for others to learn, cook and share together for confidence building. Evidence shows that people are more likely to make changes to their eating habits and try new foods if they cook the dishes for themselves. Cooking together and sharing what is made is an effective tool in promoting healthier eating.

A Food Champion enables local communities to gain the knowledge, practical skills, and confidence that would make a real difference to their range of food choices, eating habits, and where sustained, an improvement in health and wellbeing in the long-term.

The Somerset Food Champions are offered various types of support from the Zing Service and its valued partnership network. The types of support are reviewed continually to make sure that they are appropriate for the needs of the Champions to support and sustain their role. The current support ranges from free training and a Somerset Food Champion Certificate of Completion to free promotional resources such as recipe and food growing cards and

healthier lifestyle leaflets.

After training, the Somerset Food Champions will form part of the growing network of champions across Somerset. The aim of the Somerset Food Champion Network is to co-learn, share resources, and reflect on learnings, and to build knowledge, skills, and confidence in promoting nutritionally balanced foods to support a healthier lifestyle and reduce the risk of lifestyle diseases. Quarterly network meetings (a mix of online and face-to-face) will be arranged by the Zing Service.

#### Who can become a Somerset Food Champion?

Trainees will be recruited via organisations with providers representing and serving communities across Somerset – particularly people most vulnerable and at risk. These providers will include, for example, Health Coaches, Social Prescribers (including Village Agents and Community Connectors), registered Volunteers, and employees interested in workplace wellbeing. If you are not registered with an organisation, then please contact us for guidance.
