Who to Contact

The relationship between school and home is a key one as a successful partnership between us will support your child's learning, progress and happiness at school. Our aim is to work with you and your child to ensure that happens, which is why it's important to talk with us if you have any questions, concerns or wish to share information with us. Our reception staff will be able to direct you to the right member of staff but, as a general guide, the key routes for contact are as follows:

- > For most pastoral matters, your child's tutor will be the first point of contact;
- ➤ If the matter remains unresolved, or for more complex pastoral matters, please ask for your child's Head of Year;
- For matters relating to lessons and learning in a single lesson, please contact your child's teacher in the first instance;
- ➤ If the matter remains unresolved or is more complex, please ask for the Head of Faculty in that subject area;
- For other matters, please describe your situation to our reception staff and they will direct you to the appropriate member of staff.

Please remember that many of our staff are also teachers which means that they will not be able to make immediate responses due to their teaching commitments. We aim to respond to all queries within 2 working days; for more complex queries this initial contact may be a holding response whilst we look into your concerns. If your concern is more urgent, please explain that when you make contact.

Use of Aerosol Deodorants

I would like to bring your attention to the fact that any aerosols, including spray deodorants and perfumes ,are *banned items* in the Academy and students are not able to bring these items into the Academy. Amongst both the staff and student body we have a number of severe asthmatics and use of these sprays can cause a severe, life-threatening asthma attack. This extends to the smell and particles lingering in the air a few minutes after a spray is used. Aerosols are also flammable and a risk to our fire protection and detection measures. Therefore, please can you ensure that your child *does not bring aerosols into school*. Incidents of use by students will result in confiscation of the item and may result in further consequences. Students will also be reminded of this rule through assemblies.

School Blazers

All students are expected to wear their school blazer at all times with the exception of in lessons where the teacher has given permission, when eating in the canteen or if playing sport. As we begin to enjoy the warmer weather, students can begin to remove their jumpers which are worn underneath. Our blazer is a vital part of the Academy uniform.

Mobile Phones

We continue to be very impressed by the majority of students who adhere to the Academy's expectation that mobile phones are 'off and away' during school hours [08:30 - 15:30]. It is so important that our learners are able to detach from the distractions that mobiles offer, encouraging interaction and wellbeing.

When students are seen using their mobile phones, they are expected to hand this to the relevant member of staff who in turn passes it along to our re-tracking base. Students collect their phone from this room at the end of the school day.

If required, students are welcome to use the phones in reception should they need to contact parents/carers for issues such as topping up money for food or arranging alternative transport home. We kindly ask parents/carers **not** to message their children directly during the school day, this can be a source of distraction, disruption to learning and lead to their phone being confiscated.

Year 11 Exams

We would like to commend all of the Year 11 students who have already completed GCSE exams. This week Photography, 3D Design and PE students completed the practical elements and moderation activities required for their course.

With just one week remaining until the main exam season begins, we ask that all Year 11 parents/carers:

- Encourage your child to attend lunchtime and after school revision sessions
- Ensure they have a dedicated revision space, ideally free from distractions
- Ensure your child is revising during the evenings and weekends
- Contact relevant staff if unsure how to support your child to revise particular subjects
- Ensure your child arrives to school on time and in the correct uniform to ensure there are no delays to the exams

Bronze Duke of Edinburgh Training Weekend

Twenty students who are completing their Bronze Duke of Edinburgh this year took part in a fun-filled bank holiday weekend to prepare themselves for their upcoming expedition. On Saturday, students had a long day of practical and theoretical training. They looked at how to navigate confidently by refreshing their Geography map reading skills, and also learned some new compass skills including the secondary intercardinal directions and how to take a bearing. Practical skills included how to set up their camp safely, first aid, what to do in an emergency, survival skills (the bivvy bags were an interesting exercise), and the highlight of the day - cooking a gourmet meal using Trangia stoves. On the very grey (but not too rainy) Sunday, students completed a 10 mile circular walk around the local area, climbing up and down many hills - perfect preparation for the Quantocks. For some groups this was closer to 12 miles due to some navigational errors, but all groups made it back before the expected arrival time.
