Message from the Headteacher

Dear Families

Since the last edition of the Family Bulletin, our local community has suffered the impact of the flash flooding which, for some families, caused devastation. Our thoughts have been with all families who have been impacted by the floods. On a more positive note, we have been especially proud of a number of our students who got involved with the clean up - supporting neighbours and the wider local community - and are grateful to parents and members of the wider community who shared information about this with us.

This week, the GCSE written exams started in full force. We have been really pleased to witness the positivity and resilience of our Year 11 students who are coping really well so far with their exams. It is important that they build in rest and relaxation time as it is a 'long game' with the exams spreading over a number of weeks so building strategies to enable sustained effort over time is really key. Both staff and our invigilation team have commented on the impeccable way that Year 11 students have conducted themselves so far - they have been a credit to themselves and to the school. We wish them every success in the weeks to come.

We are also about to enter the exam season for students in Years 7-10. Students have exam revision lists to help them prepare but do not hesitate to contact their subject teachers if you have any queries. Students will need a full set of equipment for their exams which includes two pens, ruler, protractor, compass and a scientific calculator for Maths and Science.

Over the last few weeks, Ms Mallord has been co-ordinating the recruitment of our new student leaders and our Student Leadership Team for the next academic year. The process was completed with the process for appointing our new Head Students. The students engaged in a robust process of letters of application, informal interviews, a presentation and a final formal interview which I was privileged to be a part of with Ms Mallord and Mr Mitchell. The students were really impressive and it was fantastic to hear them talk about the school and its role in supporting their development as well as their ideas for improving aspects of the school further. We have been delighted to appoint Freya B (Student Voice inc School Council), Lyla P (Transition and New Students) and Walter T-Z (Leadership Team) to these important roles and look forward to working with them to keep improving students' experience at Ansford.

Finally, we wished Mrs Martin (from our English Department not the Finance Office) a temporary farewell today as she left for her maternity leave with her baby due on Sunday! We hope that she manages to have a bit of a rest before the baby arrives.

Who to Contact

The relationship between school and home is a key one as a successful partnership between us will support your child's learning, progress and happiness at school. Our aim is to work with you and your child to ensure that happens, which is why it's important to talk with us if you have any questions, concerns or wish to share information with us. Our reception staff will be able to direct you to the right member of staff but, as a general guide, the key routes for contact are as follows:

- > For most pastoral matters, your child's tutor will be the first point of contact;
- ➤ If the matter remains unresolved, or for more complex pastoral matters, please ask for your child's Head of Year;
- > For matters relating to lessons and learning in a single lesson, please contact your child's teacher in the first instance;
- If the matter remains unresolved or is more complex, please ask for the Head of Faculty in that subject area:
- > For other matters, please describe your situation to our reception staff and they will direct you to the appropriate member of staff.

Please remember that many of our staff are also teachers which means that they will not be able to make immediate responses due to their teaching commitments. We aim to respond to all queries within 2 working days; for more complex queries this initial contact may be a holding response whilst we look into your concerns. If your concern is more urgent, please explain that when you make contact.
