Message from the Headteacher

Dear Families

I hope that you had a lovely break at half term and that you have been able to enjoy the sunshine.

Since our last edition, we have had a number of enrichment events for our students. Miss Worthy Jarvis and a team of staff lead the Duke of Edinburgh weekend which, as one parent wrote in to express, enabled "children [to] grow in confidence and believe in themselves as well as having fun!" There was another KS3 STEM event led by Mr Hill; Miss Voit arranged for a group of chefs from the Royal Navy to come and work with some of our Year 10 Food and Catering students and Mrs Wood and the PE Team ran the termly Interform competition as well as leading the Year 1 Primary Festival for our local primary schools this week. We are grateful to staff for creating these opportunities for our young people.

The real highlight from the last week of term was our Celebration Assembly for Year 11. After the informal activities of shirt signing and cake eating, we held a more formal celebration with speeches from key staff including myself, Mr Mitchell, Ms Mallord and our team of Year 11 tutors. It was a wonderful occasion where we also presented a series of subject and character awards to recognise the significant contribution of many of our young people. Who to Contact

The relationship between school and home is a key one as a successful partnership between us will support your child's learning, progress and happiness at school. Our aim is to work with you and your child to ensure that happens, which is why it's important to talk with us if you have any questions, concerns or wish to share information with us. Our reception staff will be able to direct you to the right member of staff but, as a general guide, the key routes for contact are as follows:

- > For most pastoral matters, your child's tutor will be the first point of contact;
- ➤ If the matter remains unresolved, or for more complex pastoral matters, please ask for your child's Head of Year;
- > For matters relating to lessons and learning in a single lesson, please contact your child's teacher in the first instance;
- If the matter remains unresolved or is more complex, please ask for the Head of Faculty in that subject area:
- > For other matters, please describe your situation to our reception staff and they will direct you to the appropriate member of staff.

Please remember that many of our staff are also teachers which means that they will not be able to make immediate responses due to their teaching commitments. We aim to respond to all queries within 2 working days; for more complex queries this initial contact may be a holding response whilst we look into your concerns. If your concern is more urgent, please explain that when you make contact.



Important reminders:

- ➤ Be prepared equipment, you must ensure you bring all the equipment you need for the exam you are taking, in a clear pencil case
- > Calculators you must clear the memory on your calculator, and you must not bring the lid into the exam
- > Attendance go straight to your morning exams (no registration)
- > Timings be on time!! Note that afternoon exams start at 2:15pm
- Exams noticeboard remember to check the exams noticeboard for timings, rooms and seating plans
- > Food and drink food is not authorised in the exam room unless agreed in exceptional circumstances. You may have water – in a clear bottle with no labels or design
- > Arriving late if you arrive late, do not worry go to the Exams Office and we will assist you getting into your exam
- Missed exams, catch-up If you miss an exam for any reason, go to the Exams office to arrange when you can sit it
- Access arrangements if you are unsure what exam access arrangements may be in place for you, go to the Exams Office
- > Special considerations The Exams Office is here to help you. If you have encountered any problems or difficulties leading up to or on the day of the exam that may affect your ability to do your best, please tell us.
