You may remember that we had been getting ready to perform last year but had to postpone the event midrehearsals due to the escalating number of COVID cases and the increased restrictions that we faced at that time. Mr Newbury and the cast did not give up hope and have been working hard since then to bring this fabulous production to life. We are so proud of all the young people who have been involved whether it's on stage or behind the scenes and we are really grateful to all the staff involved who have made it happen - in particular Mr Newbury who has worked tirelessly to put on the show. We have further Christmas related events next week including the Christmas Dinner on Thursday 15th, which is also 'Christmas Jumper Day' where we hope to raise some funds for Save the Children. Year 11 have really impressed us all this week with their mature approach to their Trial exams. In spite of the nerves, students have managed really well and are learning a lot from the process. The 'mock' exams are a really important opportunity for students to experience the feel of a full set of exams and they help to prepare students well for the real event in June next year. We hope that our Year 11 students will have an opportunity to rest and recover over the Christmas holiday.

This week has also seen the launch of a great STEM event that Mr Hill is leading for some of our students in Year 8. We welcomed graduate engineering apprentices from Leonardo Helicopters in school to kick off the Flying Start Challenge. This is run in conjunction with Airbus, Leonardo, Safran and the Royal Navy with the aim of teaching students about the Physics and practicalities of flight and is in preparation for them designing and building a glider.

We were really pleased to welcome Year 10 Families into school last night for their first face to face parents' evening for a long time. There were lots of positive conversations to support students to achieve their best. Who to Contact

The relationship between school and home is a key one as a successful partnership between us will support your child's learning, progress and happiness at school. Our aim is to work with you and your child to ensure that happens, which is why it's important to talk with us if you have any questions, concerns or wish to share information with us.

Sometimes, especially when you are new to the school, it can be hard to know who to contact. Our reception staff will be able to direct you to the right member of staff but as a general guide, the key routes for contact are as follows:

- > For most pastoral matters, your child's tutor will be the first point of contact;
- ➤ If the matter remains unresolved, or for more complex pastoral matters, please ask for your child's Head of Year;
- For matters relating to lessons and learning in a single lesson, please contact your child's teacher in the first instance;
- ➤ If the matter remains unresolved or is more complex, please ask for the Head of Faculty in that subject area;
- For other matters, please describe your situation to our reception staff and they will direct you to the appropriate member of staff.

Please remember that many of our staff are also teachers which means that they will not be able to make immediate responses due to their teaching commitments. We aim to respond to all queries within 2 working days; for more complex queries this initial contact may be a holding response whilst we look into your concerns. If your concern is more urgent, please explain that when you make contact.

From Mr Musson, Deputy Headteacher: Curriculum and Standards

Parents' Evening Survey Feedback

Thank you to everyone who took the time to complete our recent survey on Parents' Evening. It has been a really valuable exercise, collecting both parent and staff views on how we should organise parents' evenings in the future. The general consensus (approximately 80% of parents and carers who responded, across all year groups) is that face to face meetings are really important so there are opportunities for parents and staff to meet as they are more personable. However, some families did request that we provide opportunities for virtual appointments.

Survey: Key Points

- 1. There was a consensus that as students progress through their educational journey it becomes more important to hold face to face meetings.
- 2. Virtual meetings are really valuable for some families to help resolve difficulties e.g. child care arrangements, distance to travel, anxiety of attending a busy evening etc.
- 3. Families and staff raised the importance of ensuring timings with face to face meetings are adhered to so queues can be avoided one of the advantages of virtual meetings. It was mentioned, quite rightly, that it can be frustrating when a virtual meeting gets 'cut off' when the allocated time ends.
- 4. The importance of having focused discussions about the individual and not a summary of what has been taught.

Outcomes

- 1. To have a blended approach for each parents' evening to provide parents with the opportunity to select an option of either virtual or face to face
- 2. To ensure, as far as possible, that face to face meetings are kept to the time allocated so waiting times are minimised
- 3. To ensure content of discussions are focused on the individual, rather than focused on course content or more general points, so that clear improvement actions are discussed to ensure progress in learning

More information will follow as each scheduled parents' evening takes place. We will continue to review the way that we run parents' evenings so that we can make them as accessible as possible for our families.
