Dear Families

I hope that the Christmas break has been a peaceful and restful one and send my best wishes for a Happy New Year which I hope has started well for you.

Our INSET day on Tuesday this week focused on important training relating to SEND provision and practice at Ansford. It was a really informative day that provided many essential updates for staff. We were delighted to welcome back our students on Wednesday, especially as the majority were wearing their uniform so well and with pride. We have had a really positive first week back and students have impressed us with the way that they have adapted quickly back to life at school.

As Year 11 families will know, we said farewell to Mr Hill (Head of Year 11 and Teacher of PE) at the end of last term as he moved on to a new role. In the short time that he was with us, Mr Hill played a really important part in the lives of our Year 11 students and was a real asset to the school. I am sure that you will join me in wishing him well on his next steps. We are very fortunate that Ms Mallord, a very experienced Head of Year, will be taking on the leadership of Year 11 alongside her current work with Year 10. She will be supported by Mrs Switzer who will be taking on responsibility as Deputy Head of Year 10 and Year 11.

At the end of term, we also said goodbye to Mrs Lee Mosley who has served the school for many years as a Governor. We have been really grateful for the loyalty and commitment that Lee has offered to the school; her service to the community has been highly valued and will be greatly missed. If you haven't been hit by ill health in the family over the Christmas period, you are likely to be in a minority as it appears that many viruses and winter illnesses were circulating at high levels. You may have seen that the UK Health Security Agency has issued some advice to parents on how they can help to ensure that their child doesn't catch and spread illness. The advice identifies three important elements for parents and carers which I share with you below:

- Emphasising the routines of handwashing
- Advising to keep your child off school if they are ill and have a temperature
- Advising to book a flu jab for your child if they are eligible (more information about eligibility can be found on NHS.UK.)

Who to Contact

The relationship between school and home is a key one as a successful partnership between us will support your child's learning, progress and happiness at school. Our aim is to work with you and your child to ensure that happens, which is why it's important to talk with us if you have any questions, concerns or wish to share information with us.

Sometimes, especially when you are new to the school, it can be hard to know who to contact. Our reception staff will be able to direct you to the right member of staff but as a general guide, the key routes for contact are as follows:

- > For most pastoral matters, your child's tutor will be the first point of contact;
- If the matter remains unresolved, or for more complex pastoral matters, please ask for your child's Head of Year:
- For matters relating to lessons and learning in a single lesson, please contact your child's teacher in the first instance;
- > If the matter remains unresolved or is more complex, please ask for the Head of Faculty in that subject area;
- > For other matters, please describe your situation to our reception staff and they will direct you to the appropriate member of staff.

Please remember that many of our staff are also teachers which means that they will not be able to make immediate responses due to their teaching commitments. We aim to respond to all queries within 2 working days; for more complex queries this initial contact may be a holding response whilst we look into your concerns. If your concern is more urgent, please explain that when you make contact.

Children and Young People Self Harm Awareness Training for Parents, Carers and Family Members in Somerset

As we know from the media, self-harm is on the rise amongst young people. If you or someone you know would like to learn more about self-harm and how to help children and young people in distress then please see the course brief and registration details below. This course is free to attend and takes place online.



This 90-minute session will be delivered virtually via Zoom/MS Teams and will cover the following:

Understand self-harm and who it can affect

- Identify reasons that can lead a young person to self-harm
- Recognise the stigma surrounding self-harm and the impact this can have
- Understand the wider impact self-harm has on friends and family, with a focus on parents/carers
- Raise confidence in responding to/supporting young people who self-harm
- Establish how to maintain your own self-care and wellbeing
- Identify a range of local and national resources/services/information to support young people who self-harm
- Understand the importance of recovery
