Message from the Headteacher

Dear Families

Since our last Family Bulletin, we have been delighted to welcome our Year 9 Families into school for two important events as students in this year group prepare to make important decisions about their KS4 option choices: Parents' Evening and Options Evening. Options Evening last night was a really busy event with extremely high numbers of families present to gather information to inform next steps. Year 9 Parents' Evening was the first since our consultation with you in the autumn term. Having listened to your feedback, this event was the first of our 'hybrid' events so we were able to offer both virtual and in-person appointments. This worked really well as it enabled parents and carers to adopt their preferred approach. We will be continuing with the hybrid model moving forwards so if you do have any feedback about how we can improve the event ahead of the next parents' evening, please do let us know.

January has seen students participating in trips and visits that have taken them beyond Somerset. Many thanks to Mrs Withers for leading and organising the Year 7 Maths Circles Trip to Exeter. Students involved were a real credit to the school, working well with students from other schools in the South West in different groups and showing great engagement in Maths discussions. They will continue this project on a weekly basis online until their next visit to Exeter in July. In addition, our Year 10 and Year 11 Art and Design and Photography students enjoyed a day in London visiting the Saatchi Gallery and The Tate Britain. Students had a fantastic day getting the chance to experience art work first hand as well as broadening their creative knowledge and understanding. Many thanks to Mrs Reddick and Mrs Swallow for creating this opportunity for our young people.

As you may be aware from recent news reports, it has now been confirmed that teachers who are members of the NEU Union will be holding four days of strike action. The action is the result of a dispute between the NEU and the Government and does not involve individual schools. The first of the four days of strike action will take place on *Wednesday 1st February 2023*. The strike action is likely to cause disruption at Ansford due to the numbers of our teaching staff who are members of the NEU. We are currently assessing the impact on our provision. We will write to you in due course to confirm the arrangements.

Finally, I would like to welcome Miss Hayley Liu who is joining our administration team at Ansford. She will initially be working as part of our reception team so you may well speak to her if you call into reception or telephone our main phone line.

My name is Jennie White and, until very recently, I worked in the education sector. I started my teaching career working with adult male prisoners and young offenders and have also held a number of roles including Director of Education for an alternative provision, Headteacher and CEO of a Multi Academy Trust. I am now the CEO of Level Trust, a charity that works to support children and families living in poverty to access a range of educational opportunities and resources.



I feel very privileged to have spent my whole career working with children and young people- they have taught me so much and made my working life extremely happy and fulfilling. I hope to put my previous experience to good use in my work at Ansford to provide both support and challenge so that all children receive an outstanding education.

Who to Contact

The relationship between school and home is a key one as a successful partnership between us will support your child's learning, progress and happiness at school. Our aim is to work with you and your child to ensure that happens, which is why it's important to talk with us if you have any questions, concerns or wish to share information with us.

Sometimes, especially when you are new to the school, it can be hard to know who to contact. Our reception staff will be able to direct you to the right member of staff but as a general guide, the key routes for contact are as follows:

- > For most pastoral matters, your child's tutor will be the first point of contact;
- If the matter remains unresolved, or for more complex pastoral matters, please ask for your child's Head of Year:
- For matters relating to lessons and learning in a single lesson, please contact your child's teacher in the first instance:
- > If the matter remains unresolved or is more complex, please ask for the Head of Faculty in that subject area;
- For other matters, please describe your situation to our reception staff and they will direct you to the appropriate member of staff.

Please remember that many of our staff are also teachers which means that they will not be able to make immediate responses due to their teaching commitments. We aim to respond to all queries within 2 working days; for more complex queries this initial contact may be a holding response whilst we look into your concerns. If your concern is more urgent, please explain that when you make contact.

Online Safety

We have had concerns about the interactions some of our students are having through the game Roblox. Here are six tips to help keep your child safe on Roblox.

1. Sign up with the correct age

Make sure your child creates an account using the correct age. On Roblox, certain safety settings and parental controls are enabled by default for children under 13. However, you should still review the settings to ensure they've been set up correctly.

2. Build a list of age-appropriate games

Not all games on Roblox will be appropriate for your child. The platform has a setting that lets parents and carers limit what their child can play by allowing them to build lists of age-appropriate games. You can also switch off in-app spending or set monthly limits.

3. Explore communication settings

You can manage who your child can speak to by disabling chat completely or limiting it to friends only. You can also switch off their inbox to stop them receiving direct messages.

4. Explore the platform together

Ask your child to give you a demonstration of the platform to help you understand how they use it and explore some of the parental controls together. You could even consider setting up your own account and playing the games yourself.

5. Have regular conversations about gaming

Continue to <u>have regular conversations</u> with them about what they are doing online. Ask your child open questions like "what games have you been playing on Roblox recently?" or "What platforms have you been using to play games?"

6. Use the Online Safety Hub



ClassCharts Spring Term 1

Hopefully, you have been keeping in touch with the progress of our implementation of ClassCharts which we launched at Ansford at the start of this academic year. The *ClassCharts* platform offers many functions and we have been rolling out different elements with staff, students and parents and carers. So far, as parents and carers, you will have been able to view your child's positive behaviour points and also the Homework Calendar. Staff have also been using the seating plans function and all aspects of the behaviour points function.

To date academy staff have awarded 93,500 reward points, an average of 162 points per student which celebrate their focus, contributions, kindness, organisation and day to day excellent conduct. In the same way as last term, students can spend their reward points in the Reward Shop on *ClassCharts*. For Spring Term 1, this opens to students on Monday 30th January. Orders must be placed by Friday 3rd February to receive rewards before half term.

Since September, we have continued to track and monitor negative behaviour points across all subject areas on a student level basis and our pastoral staff will have made contact with you if we are concerned about negative patterns of behaviour. However, during stage one of our roll out, whilst we have been establishing this new way of working for staff, the negative points have not been visible to you or your child. This will change on <u>Monday 6th February</u> when the negative points function will be opened to students and parents to view from their <u>ClassCharts</u> account. A really useful tool on your account is the section which shows overall behaviour patterns in the form of two graphs as shown below:



In the same way that you will have seen the positive behaviour points hold different values, you will see the same pattern with the negative behaviour points as these can carry a -1, -3 or -5 points allocation which is explained in the following table.

-1	Classroom teachers and support staff will log incidents of negative behaviour as a -1. They will liaise with their line managers if further action or support is required.
-3	Heads of Faculty and Heads of Year will log incidents of negative behaviour as a -3 as they often hold a wider contextual awareness of situations and will oversee appropriate consequences.
-5	Senior Leaders may use this option to record serious incidents which may lead to a higher level of consequence.


