Message from the Headteacher

Dear Families

I would like to thank families for their support and kind words following the unexpected death of Mr Glenn Tracey who has been our IT Manager at Ansford for many years. An unexpected loss of this nature hits a community hard and it is the kind support of others that really helps. We will be finding our own ways to remember Mr Tracey and all that he has done for our community here at Ansford over the coming months and will share these with you in due course.

As you will be aware from previous communications, the second day of strike action for the NEU (largest teaching union) will be taking place on Thursday 2nd March. A separate letter will be sent to families detailing the arrangements for the day so please look out for that in your inbox.

Whilst it was a pleasure to see so many parents attending the second Year 11 Parents' Evening (either virtually or in person) this academic year, it was also a time of sadness as it was 'the last' parents' evening for some families. This time of the academic year can feel a very strange one for Year 11 students and their families as the countdown to the GCSE examinations begin and the end of 11-16 education approaches. Amongst other things, it can feel a time of pressure, a time of excitement or a time of worry about the future - all feelings that are completely normal but can be challenging to manage. Our Year 11 students remain a priority for us as we support them to manage the challenges of their last few months at Ansford successfully.

Our GCSE Drama students had a great time in London when they went to see a performance of a Woman in Black which is one of their set texts - many thanks to Mr Newbury and the accompanying staff for providing this experience. It has also been lovely to welcome our Year 3 visitors from the local primary schools when they attended for the recent Sports' Festival - many thanks to Mrs Wood and her team for their work in creating those opportunities.

Many of you will be aware of our school's pivotal role in creating the longstanding link between the communities of Castle Cary and Mufulira, which started in 1994. Some of you may also have been directly involved on one of the many exchange visits. If so, the Cary-Mufulira Community Partnership Trust (CMCPT) would like to hear from you, as they would like to bring together all exchange participants in a 'Virtual World', to celebrate the 30th Anniversary of the link. We are delighted to welcome Mrs Marshfield back from her maternity leave this week. Mrs Marshfield is returning to her role as Head of Creative Arts after a year away and has already commented on the positive changes that she is seeing at Ansford, particularly in terms of student behaviour and attitudes.

We have also received similar feedback from an external consultant who has been working with us this week to provide support as we continue to develop the provision at Ansford. Verbal feedback from the visit has been really positive with many areas of improvement noted since the last visit at the end of last academic year.

Who to Contact

The relationship between school and home is a key one as a successful partnership between us will support your child's learning, progress and happiness at school. Our aim is to work with you and your child to ensure that happens, which is why it's important to talk with us if you have any questions, concerns or wish to share information with us.

Sometimes, especially when you are new to the school, it can be hard to know who to contact. Our reception staff will be able to direct you to the right member of staff but as a general guide, the key routes for contact are as follows:

- > For most pastoral matters, your child's tutor will be the first point of contact;
- ➤ If the matter remains unresolved, or for more complex pastoral matters, please ask for your child's Head of Year;
- > For matters relating to lessons and learning in a single lesson, please contact your child's teacher in the first instance;
- > If the matter remains unresolved or is more complex, please ask for the Head of Faculty in that subject area;
- > For other matters, please describe your situation to our reception staff and they will direct you to the appropriate member of staff.

Please remember that many of our staff are also teachers which means that they will not be able to make immediate responses due to their teaching commitments. We aim to respond to all queries within 2 working days; for more complex queries this initial contact may be a holding response whilst we look into your concerns. If your concern is more urgent, please explain that when you make contact.

Mobile Phone Apps

We have been made aware of two mobile phone apps that we are concerned about and wanted to make you aware of. Both of these apps are designed to put children in contact with each other to make friends, however this has been exploited by those who are wishing to send inappropriate messages and images.



There are no parental controls available on Wizz. This and the very nature of random connection and digital communication combine to provide easy, and seemingly innocent, direct access to children. Whilst it is not impossible to meet a great friend online, apps that require no authenticity or verification from its users are not the likely source of quality friendships.

Digital communication of this kind allows for quick words and impulsive requests that lack respect and dignity. Even if you don't allow your son or daughter to have an app like Wizz, it remains imperative to teach (and re-teach) appropriate and respectful communication.



Likee is a short video creation platform where users can be creative, share videos, add music, and use filters. Users can search different hashtags and explore content posted by others worldwide, with the option to filter by location. You don't need an account to watch the most popular videos, but users do need to be logged in to access video content posted by nearby users. Accounts can be created using a phone number, Facebook, or Instagram account. Date of birth is also required – but this information is not shown publicly.

Likee uses levels to encourage users to earn more XP (experience points) which are earned by opening Likee every day, watching/posting videos, fan growth and sending/receiving gifts. It features in app purchases, whereby users can buy 'diamonds' and gift these as 'beans', which can be cashed out of the app for real currency. Users can click the top right corner to 'reward' another user.

The risks of Likee:

- There are no age restrictions when signing up to the app.
- The app can feature inappropriate content, including suggestive language & violence.
- You CANNOT make an account private.
- In the safety settings 'Hide Location' & 'Hide my Videos in Nearby' are automatically set to public by default.
- Likee has substandard reporting functions Users can report videos but there is no function to report a live stream or another user.
- There's scope for grooming, coercion and abuse through its gifting feature.
- As per other live streaming/video platforms, viewers can manipulate the actions of users by gifting.
- In app parental controls are ineffective.

What parents can do:

- Have open and honest conversations with children and young people in your care about not sharing personal information online.
- Check that young people know how to turn off location settings, and configure safety settings on the Apps they use.
- Check that they only engage with other people they know online.
- Check that they understand what they should do if they see something online that upsets or worries them.
- If you are concerned about an App your child is using, download it and use it yourself- or use it together to get a feel for it.

If your child has been approached inappropriately by an adult online, you should contact the police immediately.
