## Message from the Headteacher

### **Dear Families**

We are really pleased to see that students have settled back into school routines really well and it has been lovely to see students in all year groups focused on their learning in lessons and displaying positive behaviours both in and out of the classroom.

Although we have only just reached the end of our second full week of the autumn term, we have already hosted a number of events. We were pleased to welcome the families of our new Year 7 students back into school to meet their tutors and to have another opportunity to get to know Ansford a little better. Our KS4 students and their families have also returned to school in the evening for key events: Year 10 for their 'Information Evening' and Year 11 for their 'Moving On' event where they were able to connect with a range of Post 16 providers. It has been really lovely to see so many families in school and speaking positively about their experiences at Ansford.

Rehearsals are already well underway for this year's production of Beauty and Beast and we are really grateful to Mrs Di Pinnions for organising the 'Ansford Academy in Bloom' flower arranging event to raise money to support the production - a magnificent £250 was raised which is just brilliant.

## From the Safeguarding Team

## **Keeping Safe Reminders**

Throughout the week, the Safeguarding Team have been delivering assemblies to all year groups about where to go if they need help or support whilst at school. We have also been providing reminders about what to do if the fire alarm and/or lockdown alarm sounds.

## What is a security lockdown and when would it happen?

A security lockdown procedure is a standard health and safety procedure, similar to a fire drill. Our security lockdown procedure would be used when there is a threat to the safety of our students, staff and others in the school, and when it's safer for everyone to remain in school rather than evacuate. The aim is to keep people safe by confining them to a secure place of safety.

Situations where our security lockdown procedure may be used include:

- A potentially dangerous person or animal on the school site
- A disturbance or dangerous situation in the local community that could affect the school
- A nearby chemical incident or other risk of air pollution

• An incident related to terrorism

In our assemblies, we have taken the time to talk to all of our students about security lockdown procedures and to explain why they're important. We have reassured them that they are safe, and have explained that practising procedures like this will make sure that the school remains a safe place to learn.

## From Mr Mitchell, Assistant Headteacher: Community and Conduct

#### **A Fantastic September**

We are immensely proud of how our students have returned and settled into their routines this month. The Class Charts data shows that the vast majority of students are earning multiple reward points during the day for their ongoing efforts and fantastic conduct in and out of lessons, come rain or shine.

Last week, we conducted our first fire and evacuation training. Our Year 7 students performed perfectly and our Key Stage 4 students set a fantastic example for others to follow.

We've also enjoyed seeing many of our students reconnect with sport and enrichment during lunchtimes. By way of reminder, students who take part in PE activities are permitted to stay in their PE kit during P5 - they will be given a ticket at the end of the session to show to their teacher.

#### **Class Charts - Detentions**

Whilst we hope that your child does not receive a detention for negative conduct or disruptive behaviour, we would like to share with all families how detentions are communicated to families.

All detentions are booked on Class Charts. Families will receive an email (using the email address entered by users when signing into the app) to notify them of the detention type, date, time, venue, teacher, length of time and

any notes added by the teacher.

Please note, ordinarily, staff will not follow up by telephone.

If a student fails to attend a detention, our internal 'upscaling' system will escalate the detention to the next stage. For example, not attending a teacher's break or lunchtime detention, especially when the student was informed of the details, they will be upscaled to an after school detention.

## **Uniform Update**

Please ensure your child arrives at school with their blazer. Students are expected to wear their blazers at all times; teachers will give permission for these to be removed during lessons when necessary.

Jumpers can be worn underneath but should not be a sweatshirt style or contain branded logos. Students will be asked to remove these and they may be confiscated if they repeatedly wear these.

Finally, hoodies are not permitted as a form of coat or jumper. As above, these will be confiscated for the duration of the day.

## Wet Weather

This week we noticed a number of students arriving at school without coats. We kindly ask that you encourage them to pack one, even if it stays in their bag. A number were caught out during the sudden downpours this week. Many of our tutors open up their rooms during break and lunchtime for students to relax in. When the weather is particularly poor, our canteen (dining hall area) is reserved for Years 7, 8 and 9 to sit, socialise and eat. PA2 is open for Years 10 and 11.

## Late Buses

We would like to offer our apologies for the lateness of some of our buses arriving at bus stops in the morning and after school. Please be assured that we are keeping accurate records of these and are liaising with Somerset County Transport Services who manage the contracts with our providers. Our students typically respond brilliantly - we do appreciate that the lateness may be having an impact on family plans or routines.
