We wanted to remind you about the NHS Somerset app that was launched in the summer. The Tellmi App supports the mental health and emotional well-being of children and young people in Somerset, through pre-moderated peer support, where young people can safely talk about difficult issues including relationships, friends, college, anxiety, appearance, exams, break ups, Covid and learn how to help themselves by helping each other. The App gives pupils the ability to share their worries anonymously and get support from other young people, the app is easy to download and is completely FREE . We also want to make you aware that The Mental Health Support Team (MHST) are running a Self-Harm

Awareness Workshop on Wednesday 8th November 9.30am -11am . This workshop is FREE and is available for all Parents, Carers and Family Members. The workshop will focus around :-

- Understanding self-harm and who it can affect
- Identifying reasons that can lead a young person to self-harm
- Recognising the stigma surrounding self-harm and the impact this can have
- Understanding the wider impact self-harm has on friends and family, with a focus on parents/carers
- Raising confidence in responding to/supporting young people who self-harm
- Establishing how to maintain your own self-care and wellbeing
- Identifying a range of local and national resources/services/information to support young people who self-harm
- Understanding the importance of recovery

Excellent Student Conduct

We are absolutely thrilled to see the enormous number of positive behaviour logs that were awarded to our students over the last 5 weeks from staff working across our Academy. In total, 40,450 reward points were issued in the first 5 weeks of the academic year. Even more impressive is our current Positive/Negative points ratio which stands at 19:1.

Student Council

We are thrilled to announce the formation of our 2023/24 Student Council Stronger than ever and keen to help drive forward further initiatives and ensure that students are well represented in decision making, our 42 strong team undertook a formal training event helping to shape the vision and structure of sub teams.

This week, students were asked about their understanding of Safeguarding within schools and spoke highly of the current access to support that our students enjoy, if and when needed. They also helped to identify areas and tools which exist but require ongoing promotion to ensure all students know how to use these to support their mental health or ability to anonymously report concerns.
