Mobile Phones and Connected Devices

In light of recent government guidance regarding the use of mobile phone usage within schools, we used this as an opportunity to revisit our mobile phone policy with staff and students. Our policy was updated and implemented in June 2022 and has not changed. It has been a useful exercise to remind students of why Ansford, and the vast majority of other schools, have a clear zero tolerance approach with the expectation that all mobile phones are 'OFF and AWAY' during school hours. Each year group had an additional assembly on Tuesday 20th/Wednesday 21st February in order to ensure that all students received the same information to ensure a consistent message was shared and to allow them to ask questions.

Precise details regarding mobile phones can be found on page 11 of the Academy's Behaviour Management Policy

The following key points were shared with students:

- We have not changed or amended the mobile phone policy.
- Students are responsible for ensuring their own mobile phones, including headphones or any other connected device are OFF and AWAY between 8.30am 3.30pm.
- This applies to all areas of the school site [including break and lunch time].
- If a student is seen using their mobile phone, or connected device, the item is confiscated and held in our Retracking base until 3.30pm.
- We record these incidents using Class Charts noting if the items were handed over with compliance or further interventions were required.
- Refusal to follow these expectations will result in further consequences including: removal from lesson, retracking and in the most extreme cases, suspension.
- Students who receive 3 logs / confiscations will be issued a mobile phone ban or a contract which requires them to hand their phone to their Head of Year at the gate upon arrival to school.

We are pleased that the vast majority of our students rarely use their phones during the school day and understand the reasons why mobile devices are not permitted.

Staff can direct students to use mobile phones within lessons to support learning activities, for example, Bedrock or complete research tasks which are done under supervision. Students will have their phones confiscated if they misuse them during these activities.

Ready to Learn: Stationery

It would be extremely useful if families could check their child's essential stationery each week to avoid disruption to lessons to loan items such as: pens, pencils or calculators. Please refer to our website using this <u>link</u>. Students are able to spend their reward points on ClassCharts to order all items which appear on our required list.

Year 11 Statements of Examination Entries

Year 11 students have been provided with their Statement Examination of Entry today. It is important that Statements of Entry are carefully checked, to ensure students have been entered for the qualifications they are expecting, and where applicable, at the correct tier.

Some essential dates to be aware of are the dates the awarding bodies have designated as 'Contingency Days' for examinations. The afternoons of Thursday 6 and Thursday 13 June have been allocated, as well as the day of Wednesday 26 June. Students MUST remain available up to and including WEDNESDAY 26 JUNE 2024 should an awarding body need to invoke its contingency plan.

Please ensure both you and your child check the Statement of Entry carefully, and contact either the Examinations Office (exams@ansford.net), or Ms Mallord (jane.mallord@ansford.net) if you believe any entries may be incorrect.


