Seeking Advice and Guidance

It can be difficult to know where to go for advice and guidance. Below we have signposted a number of places which may be of use to you.

- The Somerset Parent Carer Forum has a wealth of information for parents including resources, advice about how to make referrals and events that are taking place. It is a parent led organisation, with all the people leading their having a child or young person between birth to 25 years with additional needs and/or disabilities. Their core purpose is to ensure parent carers in Somerset have a voice and help to make sure that services reflect the needs of local families. They are independent from the NHS, Local Authority and other education, health and care services, so parent carers can talk to us confidently and freely about their views and experiences. - Parent Zone Cyber Security Resources for Young People Issues around cyber security have grown over the past few years. Use of the internet and social media is now commonplace and we must ensure we are able to protect children, whilst preparing them for their future lives. It is vital that we begin teaching children and young people the do's and don'ts of online safety. 
At the start of the year, our student council agreed that students should not have to save up points all year long to spend on reward trips. Instead, students were motivated by the idea that qualification would be dependent on maintaining a positive conduct score of at least 85%. We're thrilled to say that the majority of our students have met this target. For those who have not, they are currently enrolled in a project led by Mr Mitchell, which is designed to boost their chances over the next 4 weeks.

Ready to Learn

Can all families please ensure their child attends school each day with the essential equipment required for lessons. During a recent learning walk, I noted a number of students without the basics including pens. Minor interruptions of this nature can disrupt the flow of lessons. Bronze Duke of Edinburgh



On the weekend of the 26th April, thirty Year 9 students completed their main training in preparation for the expedition section of the Bronze Duke of Edinburgh Award. The weekend was packed full of activities and the students were exemplary in their conduct.

Friday afternoon involved planning meals for the weekend in expedition groups. Each group then sent two designated members to go grocery shopping, keeping to a strict budget whilst buying all the ingredients needed for tasty and nutritious meals. Students set up camp in the idyllic surroundings of the amphitheatre, working out how to set up their tents - the first time for many of them - and positioning their camps to minimise the effects of any inclement weather. Next, was learning how to use the Trangia stoves safely and cooking dinner. Highlights of the evening meals included spaghetti bolognese with (literal) flaming garlic bread, 1/2 pounder burgers with all the extras, and lots of pesto pasta. The evening was finished off by cooking s'mores over the campfire, a rather strange ritual involving an onion, and staff and students playing games of hide and seek, manhunt and stick in the mud before heading off to bed, worn out and ready to crawl into their sleeping bags!

Saturday morning was very cold, as the temperatures had dropped to around 3 degrees, with a fair amount of wind and rain overnight. The groups persevered, starting off their day with cooked breakfasts and lots of hot chocolate and tea. We moved inside for most of the day's activities, which included first aid training, emergency procedures and route planning. The route planning is often one of the most difficult elements of the training weekend as not only must students plot out their chosen routes for the practice walk and expedition, they must

also calculate the distance they will be walking, how long they expect each leg of the route to take, and factor in times for stops and group goals. Students were focused and a slight competitive edge appeared to see which group would complete their routes first. The day concluded at 5:00pm, and everyone was able to return home to prepare for the walk the next day.

On Sunday, the practice walk took place at Burrington Combe in the Mendip hills. Each expedition group was able to walk with a member of staff so that they could receive guidance with navigation and put into practice the map reading and compass skills they had learned in previous after school training sessions. For most groups, this guidance appeared unnecessary as they proved themselves to be competent and confident navigators, completing their walks in the expected time that they had planned for. The walk around the Mendips took them over varied terrain including Beacon Batch (the highest point in the Mendip hills), an open moorland called Black Down, woodland walks through Rowberrow Warren, finding features of an Iron Age hill fort with the Burrington Camp, and of course the caves and features of the Combe itself, carved out in the Ice Age.

A big thank you goes to Mr Howard, Ms Mitchell, Mr Musson, Mr Newbury, Ms Perkins and Mrs Holloway for helping out over this weekend so that we could deliver such good training for our students. Next up for DofE is the Bronze expedition and the Silver group practice walk in the Quantock Hills on the weekend of the 18th-19th May.




Filling Water Bottles

From Mrs Sweetlove, Pastoral Support Leader: Attendance Intervention and Support

REMINDER: Are you Eligible to Claim for Free School Meals?

Children eligible for free school meals will be provided with a meal at lunchtime which is paid for by the school. It is the responsibility of the parents or carers to register their entitlement and request free school meals for their children. Parents and carers who receive any of the following are entitled to free school meals:

- Income Support (IS)
- Employment and Support Allowance (Income Related)
- Universal Credit with an annual household income of less than £7400 after tax
- Income-based Job Seekers Allowance (IBJSA)
- Guaranteed Element of State Pension Credit
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Child Tax Credit provided they are not entitled to Working Tax Credit, with an annual taxable income (as assessed by HMRC) of less than £16,190

Only the benefits listed above qualify for free school meals. If you have recently become unemployed, but are still receiving Working Tax Credits, you may be entitled to free school meals. 

LOVE RUGBY - with Sherborne Rugby Club


