## From The Safeguarding Team

## A focus on: Water Safety

During the summer months it is likely that many students will be visiting the beach or swimming pools. We have also heard from many students that they are spending warmer days near local rivers and weirs. It is essential that children are taught how to stay safe in and near water. It would be really helpful to talk through with your child how they can do this. Below we have summarised some advice and provided links to a student friendly internet site (CBBC) and video:

## A. Stop and think - spot the dangers

It can be very cold

There may be hidden currents

It can be difficult to get out (steep slippery banks)

It can be deep

There may be hidden rubbish, e.g. shopping trolleys, broken glass

There may be no lifeguards there

It is difficult to estimate depth

It may be polluted and could make you ill.

#### B. Stay together

It is always better to go to the water with a friend or family member Children should always go near water with an adult

#### C. Float

If you fall into the water unexpectedly – float until you can control your breathing. Then call for help or swim to safety. Call 999

You may be able to help yourself and others if you know what to do in an emergency. If you see someone in difficulty, tell somebody, preferably a Lifeguard if there is one nearby, or go to the nearest telephone, dial 999, ask for the Fire Service at inland water sites and the Coastguard at the beach. 


## From Mr Mitchell, Assistant Headteacher: Community and Conduct

#### **Numeracy Ninjas**

During Half Term 5, we piloted a new tutorial activity in Years 7 and 10. Numeracy Ninjas is a fun mental maths weekly challenge which encourages students to revisit the day to day skills required. Students in both year groups have really enjoyed this weekly addition, noting how it feels purposeful and has a competitive element. Weekly scores are recorded by tutors to enable us to identify groups who will benefit from maths interventions, and groups who excel, these students will train to become peer mentors. We will launch the activity with Years 8 and 9 following the Half Term.
