Message from the Headteacher

Dear Families

Thank you so much to the many families who have completed our annual Parent and Carer Survey. Due to the INSET day on Friday, we are extending the completion deadline until 4.00pm on Tuesday 2nd July so if you have not yet had a chance to complete the survey, we would be really grateful if you can do so using the link here. We are not far from reaching our highest completion rate ever so we would love it if you can help us to do that before tomorrow morning!

Once again, life at Ansford has been full of varied experiences for our young people. Year 10 students have now completed their end of year exams and have really benefited from the experience of sitting those in a formal setting. We were really impressed with how the students conducted themselves and Mrs Dyal, our Exams Officer, comments on that in more detail below. Year 9 have had a jam packed couple of weeks as they have been involved in two events to develop their skills and experiences beyond the classroom: 'Talk the Talk' Oracy experience and a STEM event. Our Year 9 students really impressed with their conduct at both events with one of the organisers commenting that our students were "a credit to the school" and that they found Ansford to be "the friendliest, warmest school they have ever worked in".

Staff engaged in a really important training day on Friday where we spent time exploring our KS3 curriculum and assessment process as well as further promoting the importance of developing our reading provision for September. We are really grateful for the support of our colleagues from the MNSP who are continuing to work with us to move forward our school improvement priorities.

Since the last Family Bulletin, we have welcomed Mr Powell (Acting Headteacher from September) and Mr Murphy (Assistant Headteacher: Community and Conduct from September) into school to engage in handover work and support a smooth transition for September. They both have several more visits planned which will give them both the best possible start in September. Whilst Mr Murphy will be taking up the post that Mr Mitchell currently holds, the rumours that Mr Mitchell is leaving Ansford are not true! Instead, Mr Mitchell is moving into a parallel role as Assistant Headteacher: Teaching and Learning which will help us to progress work in this area more rapidly.

Uniform

We would like to take this opportunity to remind all families of our uniform policy which can be found on the Academy website and is linked here for your convenience: <u>Uniform Policy</u>

Over the last week Ms Hirst and Mr Mitchell have been presenting assemblies to all year groups. These have been focussed on upholding academy expectations and also preparing for September and the new school term. One aspect of this is with regards to student uniform.

For the rest of this academic year, the pastoral team will be ensuring that all students wear the correct uniform and will be seeking to support those students so that they wear their uniform appropriately. Please note that non uniform items will be confiscated on the Academy gates or during the school day if seen by staff. Spare uniform will be offered to those students who are not wearing appropriate uniform. As previously, those students who refuse to wear the provided uniform with be held in retracking until parents can bring in the correct uniform items or the issue has been resolved. We would ask you to reiterate these messages at home.


