Dear Families

Since the last Family Bulletin, we have welcomed Mr Powell (Acting Headteacher from September) and Mr Murphy (Assistant Headteacher: Community and Conduct from September) into school for further visits to engage in handover work and support a smooth transition for September. I know that they are both looking forward to meeting you when they start formally after the summer break.

The school calendar is always a busy one in the summer term and we have been delighted to offer a wide range of experiences 'beyond the classroom' for our young people; these are the events that really help them to live out our school values and 'learn how to be the best that they can be' in their time with us.

Having engaged in a College Experience Day last week, our Year 10 students have remained focused on their next steps as they step into the world of work for their Work Experience this week (you can read more details about both events later in the Bulletin). Once again, we are delighted to report that <u>ALL</u> of our young people were able, with the support of Wendy Watson (our independent Careers Adviser), to secure work experience placements. This is an amazing achievement as it is quite unusual to secure a 100% engagement rate and even more so to do this for two years running. Year 8 have also engaged in thinking about their futures beyond school as they experienced a valuable college visit as part of our Careers programme and we are pleased to share some further details about that event below.

We had a fantastic day last week with our new Year 7 students as they visited Ansford for their Transition Day and then we welcomed them back with their families in the evening. We were so impressed with how quickly they settled in on their first day here and were delighted to welcome many of them back to Ansford this week for our Year 6 Primary Sports Day: what great events to help support transition.

Finally, I am really grateful to all the staff who have played a part in planning, organising, promoting and attending the Year 11 Prom which took place last night. It was a really lovely event - the students looked amazing and were a pleasure to spend time with. A big THANK YOU to Helen Martin for all that she has done to bring the Prom to life, supporting our fabulous Prom Committee to make the event so memorable for all.


- Choose A level subjects that you are interested in and keep pushing yourself to reach your full potential at College or Sixth Form
