Dear Families

I have now completed my fourth full week at our school and my experience just keeps getting better. I am beginning to learn most of the students' names and It has been an absolute pleasure to be their Headteacher. I spend every day organising the lunch queue and they are always keen to tell me about their day and have a chat about their lessons and learning. It is also a great opportunity to capture how they feel about the school and their own ambitions for its future. Preparing for Year 11 Exams

Mr Musson and I, will be leading the vast majority of Year 11 assemblies this year to ensure the year group receive direct and ongoing support, helping learners to navigate what will be a very busy year.

Students taking subjects which include Non Examined Assessments [NEAs] such as Art and DT, will receive bespoke information ensuring they are acutely aware of deadlines, moderation processes and follow up intervention to ensure all work is of a quality.

Next week, I'll be talking to Year 11 about the upcoming Mock Exams in November. Each student will be given a booklet which includes really practical advice with regards to effective revision strategies and what to expect on the day. The Mock Exams serve a vitally important role within the year, helping teaching staff to identify where intervention and planning is most needed. We expect all students to perform at their very best to ensure the outcomes provide accurate assessments for all parties.

Lesson visits and student feedback

It has been an absolute delight to visit multiple lessons each day this term.

Our clearer expectations for learning behaviours have ensured students are acutely aware of what is expected of themselves and of one another. It is always a pleasure to see our young people treat staff and their peers with respect and good manners.

During a recent student voice event, multiple students commented on issues such as:

- Enjoying seeing the leadership team frequently visit lessons to look at their learning
- Enjoying the pace and rigour of lessons, knowing that challenge and effort is the norm
- Staff having a shared approach and language to address any low level disruption quickly and effectively

National Space Academy Masterclass - UPDATE

We have been privileged to have a member of the UK Space Academy join us in Science today (Wednesday).

Mr Lynch has been running workshop sessions with the Year 10 and Year 11 Triple Science students with the aim of addressing a number of the areas of the GCSE Physics Space curriculum. The students have been looking at how we observe space, the origins of the universe and how we can use space exploration to find out more about what is going on on Earth. The students have been building telescopes, investigating the idea of Red Shift and measuring ocean currents and temperatures on Earth.

A few of us have been lucky enough to hold a piece of Mars and Meteorite fragment that was formed when the Universe first formed!!

CAT Testing

All Year 7 and any students who may have joined us in-year will sit CAT4 testing starting on Monday 30th September. These are Cognitive Abilities Tests and they are designed to assess a pupil's ability in the four main areas known to make a difference to learning and achievement. This data is used to inform our teaching. Please advise your child that they can bring in headphones to wear during these assessments but they are not essential.

There are 3 tests in total and any student not in school when a test takes place, will be able to sit them soon after in arranged catch up sessions.


