



Dear Parents / Carers

During our preparation for the mock examinations in English, it has become clear that many students do not own copies of the set texts for English Literature: *A Christmas Carol* by Charles Dickens, *An Inspector Calls* by J.B. Priestley and *Macbeth* by William Shakespeare.

While we can provide some copies in school for students to use in lessons, it is essential that students have their own copies that they can re-read and annotate at home. This really is the most effective form of revision for English Literature.

With this in mind, we are offering you the opportunity to purchase texts (if you have not already done so) through the school, which should reduce the cost. The editions we recommend are as follows:

- Macbeth by William Shakespeare: £5.43
 Oxford School Shakespeare edition, ISBN 978-0-19-832400-3
- A Christmas Carol by Charles Dickens: £2.67
 Wordsworth Classics edition, ISBN 978-1-84022-756-7
- An Inspector Calls by J.B.Priestley: £8.19 Heinemann edition, ISBN 978-0-435232-82-5

Students also study 'Power and Conflict' poetry and were given an anthology from AQA in Year 10.

Other editions of the books are available to buy. However, we find it is helpful for all students to have the same edition of each text as this makes it easy for them to follow in class, locate extracts and identify quotations.
