Message from the Headteacher Mr Powell

Dear Families

So Christmas is very much in the air at the academy - as is the sound of the Matilda rehearsals. I love the play but now have the songs swimming around my head non-stop. The performers have put in a huge amount of time and effort and, if you haven't already done so, please make sure you join us for one of the shows. Tickets are selling fast and we will soon have no seats left, so don't be disappointed.

This week saw our Year 11 mock interviews and I want to personally thank all the local employers and members of the Ansford community who joined us to support the event. The feedback from visitors was overwhelmingly positive, commenting on the high levels of maturity and commitment to the morning from our students.

Feedback from the students was equally positive, who (despite initial nerves) all really valued the experience and saw it as an important step towards future interview confidence and success. Year 11 were told to wear interview appropriate clothing and they all looked amazing. There were some very sharp suits and a few students discovered it is very hard to walk for any period of time in high heels. Another life skill to learn it seems.

My assembly this week was on one of our core values at Ansford - **Respect**. I shared with the students some of the role models in my life who I most respected, including the story of my grandfather who fought in WW2 and with whom I lived growing up. I asked the students to consider their own role models and the reasons they respected them - challenging them to look for such qualities as perseverance, courage, honesty and kindness, rather than just being brash or aggressively confident as we often see with some of the influences our children see online. Respect in all aspects of our school life is the bedrock of a happy and successful experience at Ansford and it has been wonderful to see our students actively embrace making this a calm and respectful environment in which all our students can feel safe and thrive.

And talking of good influences and supporting us to be our best, this week saw the return charity match game with the staff vs students charity netball match. Staff were ever hopeful after their thrashing at football but alas the score now stands at 2-0 with another resounding victory to the students. Many thanks to the staff for supporting

and commiserations for the stiff joints felt the next day. Youth and energy again proved to be too much of an advantage.

We end the week with our Movember ritual shaving of moustaches and many thanks to Mr Mitchell, Wilson and Sandy for being such great sports. Kooth - Online Mental Health and Wellbeing Support for young People

Please find below a letter from Senior Engagement Lead from Kooth:

Over the coming weeks your child may mention they have been made aware by school or a professional of a service called Kooth. It provides a safe, secure means of accessing online emotional health support from a

professional team of qualified counsellors and emotional wellbeing practitioners for ages 11-18+ (up to 25 if care leaver/SEND).

Kooth offers wellbeing support 365 days a year via a range of self-help materials and peer to peer support which young people are able to contribute to. Kooth also has an online wellbeing team from 12pm- 10pm on weekdays and 6pm- 10pm on weekends offering 1:1 text- based online counselling via live chat or messaging.

Kooth is free to access via any internet- enabled device. Your child simply needs to visit www.kooth.com and click 'Join Kooth'. Everything is pre-moderated and age appropriate, in order to safeguard our users, so you know that what your child is accessing is safe.

Kooth will be working with all schools and professionals across 93% of the UK and growing to support students' mental health and wellbeing, both in and out of school. Alongside this, Kooth provides parent sessions, so keep in touch with the school or agencies to find out when the next ones are. I have pre recorded 2 sessions for you to watch. The 5 minute overview can be found here and a more in-depth 15 minute recording can be found here.

MOMENTS MATTER, ATTENDANCE COUNTS.

Penalty Notice Fines for School Attendance

Per Parent, Per Child

Penalty Notice Fines will now be issued to each parent, for each child that was absent.

For example; two siblings with unauthorised absence during term time may result in each parent being issued with one penalty notice per child.

5 consecutive days of Term Time Leave

Penalty Notice Fines will now be issued for Term Time Leave of 5 or more consecutive days

10 sessions of unauthorised absence in a 10-week period

Penalty Notice Fines will be considered when there has been 10 sessions (5 days) of unauthorised absence in a 10 week period.

First Offence

The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for Term Time Leave or Irregular Attendance, the amount will be:

£160 per parent, per child, paid within 28 days. Reduced to £80 per parent, per child, if paid within 21 days.

Second Offence

(within 3 years from the date of issue of first penalty notice)

The second time a Penalty Notice is issued for Term Time Leave or Irregular Attendance, the amount will be:

£160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days

Third Offence

(within 3 years from the date of issue of first penalty notice)

The third time an offence is committed for Term Time Leave or Irregular Attendance, a Penalty Notice will not be insued, and the case will be presented straight to the Magistrates' Court. Magistrates' fines can be up to £2500 per parent, per child.

This is a criminal offence and a parent may end up with a criminal record.



Gold Winner for Primary Engineer MacRobert Medal Awards - Ben M in Year 7!!!

The Primary Engineer MacRobert Medal was designed to celebrate the achievements of the school pupils, students and young engineers who have all worked together to create innovative and world changing prototypes. These prototypes came from the ideas who school pupils aged 3-19 who answered the question "If you were an engineer, what would you do?" as part of Primary Engineer's Leaders Award Competition.

This is a collaboration between The MacRobert Trust and Primary Engineer to recognise the innovation and creativity of the next generation of engineers, with ongoing support from WEIR Group.

The Primary Engineer MacRobert Medal celebrated it's third year in 2024, with the Official Award Ceremony being held in Glasgow. 24 prototypes were built, 17 were shortlisted and 10 were awarded medals. The judging panel consisted of some of the most senior figures in the engineering industry, who deliberated over every applicant. Gold, Silver and Bronze medals were handed out at the award ceremony as we celebrated their amazing achievements.

From nearly 76 THOUSAND design entries to the competition, it came down to 10 medals - Bronze, Silver and Gold.
