Message from the Head of School Mr Musson

Dear Families

The dark nights and mornings of January have finally come to an end - hooray! I must say though, despite the dark mornings (and evenings) I have thoroughly enjoyed the past month. It has been a real pleasure to lead our school in its continued improvement journey.

Last week 60 of our Year 8 students went on a trip to Shepton Mallet prison for the morning (and they all came back!). The visit was enjoyed by all and the experiences shared in the classroom will really benefit our students in studying their current English Crime and Non Fiction Unit.

On Friday, we held an Inset Day where we focused training on assessment and structured learning. As part of our drive for improvement, we are really excited to be introducing a structured learning cycle that is used in lessons to ensure consistent approaches of delivery - and so supporting students in having the same learning routines in every lesson.

Next Friday (7th February) is the big quiz night to help raise funds for the Year 11 prom. I'm very much looking forward to the evening, it should be a fun night. I've been told to make sure that I have a student on my team as last year's winning team did - not that I'm competitive at all!

We have recently invested in purchasing a Laser Cutter for DT. We are really fortunate in receiving a very kind donation by a member of the Ansford Community (who has asked not to be named) which significantly helped towards the cost. The machine looks pretty impressive and will really enhance our students' experiences within the DT department.

There are now only 10 full weeks of teaching time before the GCSE summer exams start. As a parent who has taken two daughters through GCSEs, I know how quickly this time will pass. I also know how stressful this time can be so please do not hesitate to contact Mr Newbury if you have any concerns or worries. Preparation is one way of helping avoid stress points. Mr Mitchell and I delivered an assembly to Year 11 this week focusing on the psychology of students' honesty towards the amount of revision they are completing and the excuses that are used to avoid it. We must be honest in acknowledging that revision is hard (and boring!) but the benefits are huge. Year 11 have their second round of Mock exams starting on the 24th February and structured revision every evening is the key to success.

Mr Powell and I visited a number of lessons yesterday and we were both so impressed with the purposeful learning taking place in lessons. It's been a joy to see students engaging and filling their minds with new ideas. There was a very clear message in the air that school is a place of work.

Safer Streets

Year 9 and 10 had an assembly on Friday 31st January from an organization called 'Safer Streets'. They talk to students about how to manage and de-escalate conflict, how to remove themselves from risky situations, who they can report violence to, and how to do it safely.

A workshop session involved students writing and making podcasts designed to spread these important messages to other young people.

Online Safety

Once again, we have the need to write to parents about online safety and particularly about fake accounts that may be used to send unpleasant messages to others. We talk to students about this regularly and encourage them to inform us should they ever be subject to this type of online harassment.

The police take these incidents very seriously and recommend that these sorts of crimes are reported using the online form or through calling 101.




REMINDER: Mental Health and Suicide Prevention

Alongside this we will also have a range of information workshops both face to face and online. We are grateful to NHS Somerset for funding the program and to the organisations who are supporting the delivery.



I hope that the information above is helpful in navigating the waters of GCSE Mathematics. In addition to the above, there are various different interventions taking place; you will be contacted separately about these if your child is selected to take part.

However, there are also things that you can do at home to support your child, such as talking to them about their EBIs ('Even Better Ifs' - from their previous mocks and recent assessments, these will be on feedback sheets that your child would have been given after each assessment), and encouraging them to revise these topics, using a range of resources: <u>MET website</u>, <u>Maths Genie</u>, <u>Corbett Maths</u> and <u>Mathswatch</u> (students have their own logins to this site), if there are any issues logging in, please ask your child to speak to their class teacher.

Year 8 Shepton Mallet Prison Trip - Tuesday 21st January

Sixty Year 8 students had the fantastic opportunity to go on an educational visit to Shepton Mallet Prison last week. This was planned to complement the current Year 8 Crime and Punishment Unit which explores the relationship between crime and its reporting in the media. The unit also encourages students' engagement with the moral questions that underpin crime reporting and the effectiveness and appropriateness of punishment along with the relationship between the criminal and the society that produces them.

Students are now planning their final written assessment of a non-fiction editorial, opinion piece: the opportunity to explore the oldest prison in the UK excited the students and proved to be an excellent hands-on experience to help them choose their area of interest to write about. They enjoyed exploring the cells and hearing the vivid history of the prison and its occupants over the centuries.


Doors open at 6.00pm with the quiz starting at 6.30pm.






