Our School Attendance Target is 95% - We Need Your Help!

Your child's future is built each day they are in school; support them in fulfilling their full potential by ensuring regular attendance to school.

Next term there will be a real focus on promoting the importance of high attendance and the link between attendance and attainment. Having a good education is an important factor in opening more opportunities in adult life.

Did you know that:

- a child who is absent a day of school per week misses an equivalent of two years of their school life
- 90% of young people with attendance rates below 85% fail to achieve five or more good grades of GCSE and around one third achieve no GCSEs at all
- poor examination results limit young people's options and poor attendance suggests to colleges and employers that these students are unreliable
- 7.5 million school days are missed each year through unauthorised absence

GCSEs may be near or may seem a long way off for you and your child but all absence at any stage leads to gaps in your child's learning.

This in turn can:

- mean that they fall behind in work
- affect their motivation
- affect their enjoyment of learning
- lead to poor behaviour
- affect their desire to attend school regularly affect their confidence in school
- mean they miss out on the social life of school and extra-curricular opportunities and experiences
- affect their ability to have or keep friendships.

Last week we saw the roll out of the 'Attendance Passport, this is an initiative that will support students in tracking their attendance and will open further lines of communication between tutors and tutees surrounding improving and declining attendance. Where there are persistent concerns, parents will be contacted by the tutor or pastoral team to discuss any presenting barriers to regular attendance to school.

Attendance reward points will be routinely issued to those students whose attendance is above the school target of 95% on a monthly and termly basis. Attendance success will also be acknowledged in our end of term award assemblies and those students who exceed the school target of 95% will be entered into a raffle with a chance to win a £20 amazon voucher – 5 to give away.

However, there are also things that you can do at home to support your child, such as talking to them about their EBIs ('Even Better Ifs' - from their previous mocks and recent assessments, these will be on feedback sheets that your child would have been given after each assessment), and encouraging them to revise these topics, using a range of resources: MET website, Maths Genie, Corbett Maths and Mathswatch (students have their own logins to this site), if there are any issues logging in, please ask your child to speak to their class teacher.

IET Faraday STEM Challenge Day - 4th February


On Tuesday 4th February, two teams of Year 8 students visited King Arthurs School with Mr Hunter for a IET Faraday Challenge Day. Both teams were a credit to the school and worked well in their teams.

They had to invent and make a prototype of something that could support someone with a disability, help a child learn that is between 2-5 or be used within sport.

Both Ansford teams chose the sports route one going for a headrest with fans and the other going for wickets that at the switch of a button the bails would go back on.

The teams did well throughout the day, having different roles within the team and working together to try to produce a prototype that worked. Team One with their head rest fans won but what impressed me most is that both teams had already thought about further developments for their designs. The headrest being solar powered and the stumps making a noise and lighting up and also being solar powered.


We raised £705 in total and this means our fundraising so far is £1456, which is amazing and will go towards our Year 11 Prom.



Are you interested in becoming an HGV mechanic or driver? Here are Billy's top tips:

"For anyone wanting to become a HGV mechanic be prepared to get your hands dirty, and be prepared to have to spend time away at College. I had to go to Derby to a Renault trucks college.

The toughest part of my Apprenticeship was trying to remember everything you've been taught over the 3 years for when you sit your final exams. Both in the workshop and in the classroom. You hope you get given jobs that you were taught about in the beginning to jog your memory in the lead up to your exams.

The best bit is learning new skills and having the satisfaction of fixing a truck and watching it go back out on the road. I took my class 1 HGV driving test with Yeovil driver training when I was 18, and I passed with just one minor. It means I can now drive articulated lorries. I had the best week out on the road learning, finally getting to do what I've always dreamt of doing, having grown up around my Grandad's trucks!
