Message from the Head of School Mr Musson

Dear Families

The Easter break has finally arrived and it is thoroughly deserved for all the members of the school community. Staff have worked extremely hard this term to ensure students experience a high quality education and I've been really proud with how students have responded to this. Our initial analysis of our recent Year 11 mock exam data has been extremely positive and it has clearly demonstrated to students that revision and preparation really does make a difference. Year 11 students now have a really important two weeks ahead of them using the holiday time to revise and prepare for their exams - these two weeks can be a real 'game changer' for students in their success with the upcoming GCSE's.

As you know since September, we have been implementing changes in many areas (student book documentation, curriculums, assessments, feedback processes to students, learning cycle and whole school reading). We are already seeing significant improvements with student progress in subjects and reading scores as a result of these changes. We still have work to do in embedding these changes to ensure our students receive the very best quality of education and we are looking forward to seeing our students relish the opportunities ahead.

As part of our improvement work, it is really important to us to review the impact of the changes by gathering feedback from parents/carers, students and staff will then help us with our future planning.

We wish all our families an enjoyable and restful Easter break. Even for our Year 11 students, whilst they will be working hard, it is important that they find time for things they enjoy doing, allocate time to rest, and recuperate.



Girls Rugby at Richard Huish for Year 10 & 11 Girls







However, there are also things that you can do at home to support your child, such as talking to them about their EBIs ('Even Better Ifs' - from their previous mocks and recent assessments, these will be on feedback sheets that your child would have been given after each assessment), and encouraging them to revise these topics, using a range of

Year 9 Higher Education talk

Year 9 enjoyed a talk outlining all the possibilities for Higher Education from Jenna Page – Outreach Officer for University of South Wales as part of Year 9 Careers & Options programme. Jenna covered all the possible routes including HNCs, HNDs, Higher and Degree Apprenticeships as well as the traditional full time Degree study route.

Students learned about entry requirements and the importance of GCSE grades as well as finding out about the affordability and benefits of studying for a degree. They also found out about different bursaries and scholarships available and that there are around 65,000 courses on offer – some work-based, some practical and some that aren't assessed by exams. So something to suit everyone's strengths.
