Dear Year 11 Students and Families,

We are delighted to invite you to our Year 11 Mock Results Evening on **Tuesday 9th December,** from **5.30pm to 6.30pm**.

This important event has been designed to replicate the experience students will have each summer when they collect their real GCSE results. It provides a valuable opportunity not only to receive mock results, but also to reflect thoughtfully on what these outcomes mean as students head into the final phase of the year.

During the evening, we will share the strategies we take to guide students on how to:

- Identify topics or units where they may have underperformed,
- Address specific exam skills such as timing, structuring responses, or applying key terminology that they may personally need to strengthen,
- Confidently understand areas of success that they should continue to build on.

This reflection process will help students understand their next steps clearly and feel more confident about their path towards the second set of mocks and of course the summer examinations.

We will also deliver a presentation on high-impact revision strategies, outline the range of intervention and revision hubs available, and share practical advice on how families can best support their children over the coming months.

A number of staff will be available to speak with you, including:

They will be on hand should you wish to discuss your child's progress, support needs, or exam arrangements.

Your child's full progress report will be issued on Monday 15th December. This will include 'Likely to Achieve' grades which teachers have carefully considered which take into account all assessments sat this year and in many cases during Year 10.

We warmly encourage all families to attend. This evening is a positive and purposeful step in helping students feel prepared, supported, and motivated as they work towards their GCSE examinations.
