### Message from the Head of School Mr Musson

Firstly, I want to congratulate our Year 11s on how they have approached their Mock exams over the last two weeks - they have been exceptional. This is the start of exam preparation for our year 11's, they have another set of mocks at the beginning of March - 11 weeks' time. Teachers are now busy marking the exams and then will be providing detailed feedback on how to improve ready for the second set of mocks.

Since returning after the October break students have been involved in a number of trips and events. Year 11 Geography students have visited Bristol for the second of their fieldwork trips, year 10 Textiles students visited our local John Boyd Horsehair factory in Castle Cary and on Tuesday we held our Year 5 dance festival with a mixture of some of our year 9's and 10's leading the activities. All these events bring valuable learning experiences which enriches our curriculum. As usual I was extremely proud to see how our students interacted with the primary school students and to see how much the year 5's were enjoying working with our students.

On Sunday 9th November myself and two students (Tom and Millie) represented Ansford Academy at the Castle Cary Remembrance Service. We attended the church service followed by the procession through the town and then the wreath laying ceremony at the War Memorial. Our students, as always, presented themselves outstandingly and it was an honour to have them representing our school. I was also extremely proud to see so many of our current and past students also attending in representing other local organisations (Cadet's, Scouts, The Methodist Church, Cygnets and Majorettes to name a few) at the service. It was heartwarming to see our community joining together to mark such an important event in the year.

Following feedback from our student council we have recently purchased 7 new outdoor picnic benches for students to enjoy using at break and lunchtimes. Thank you to Galhampton Country Stores for supporting us in providing these.

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## WHAT DOES ATTENDANCE LOOK LIKE FOR YOU?

We expect outstanding attendance for all, however we do recognise that there are times when pupils will absent from school.

If attendance drops below 97% the school will contact parents immediately to put a plan in place to make improvements.

100%	Perfect – 0 days off school
99%	Excellent – 2 days off school
97%	Good – 5 days off school
95%	Slight concern – 10 days off school
90%	Very Concerned – 20 days off school
85%	Extremely concerned – 30 days off school

### Attendance Update and Parent Survey Thank You

A huge thank you to all the families who recently completed our parent survey. We're currently reviewing all responses, and it has been incredibly helpful to hear your views. Your feedback plays an important part in shaping how we continue to improve our support, communication and systems.

We also wanted to make families aware that next week we will be sending out attendance update letters to all parents and carers. Each letter will share which attendance band your child currently falls into and provide a reminder of how attendance links to learning time lost.

We understand that receiving a letter about attendance can sometimes feel worrying or personal, and we want to reassure you that this is not our intention. Schools are required under the DfE guidance: Working Together to Improve School Attendance (2022 with 2024 updates) to regularly monitor and share attendance information with families, and these letters are part of our statutory responsibility.

Our aim is always to work with families, and we appreciate those parents who have already been in touch this year to discuss absences, health needs or wider circumstances affecting attendance, and we truly appreciate those open



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conversations. They help us put the right support in place early.

A quick reminder that any absence — including authorised absences such as medical appointments — does affect the overall attendance percentage. This is standard across all schools and not specific to Ansford Academy.

Above all, our communication around attendance is intended to support, inform and work in partnership to ensure every young person has the best possible chance to thrive, achieve and feel successful in school.

Thank you for your continued support — it really makes a difference.

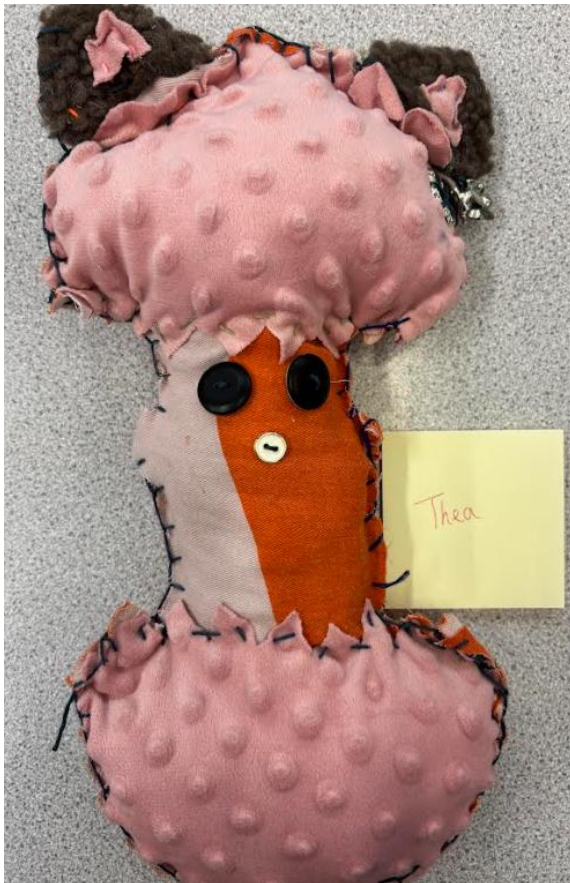
