Message from the Head of School Mr Musson

We are now at the end of our third week back after the Christmas break (It seems like a lifetime ago!) and we have three weeks to go until the February half term holiday. I must say it was delightful to welcome everyone back at the start of term and to see how quickly students got straight back into the routine of coming to school to learn, engage and thrive with their learning. It gives me such pleasure seeing our students enjoying their learning and relishing the opportunities of learning new exciting knowledge.

When I stand at the gates in the morning welcoming our students, I am also so proud of how smart our students look. Dressing smartly contributes towards the positive ethos of our school, it provides equality, contributes towards expectations and gives a sense of belonging. Since the return from the Christmas break we have had a very small number of students arriving at school in incorrect uniform (no blazer, inappropriate skirt, nose piercings, coloured hair). Whilst we address and resolve these infringements, and I thank those parents for their continued support, please can I refer you to our website [here](#) for information on our uniform expectations if any clarification is required.

This term is a really important term for our Year 9's as they embark on the process of options. Staff will be providing guidance about courses and their suitability for individuals over the next few weeks. Next week we hold our options evening, a really important event for Year 9 parents, carers and students where there will be a presentation about the process and then the opportunity to talk to teachers about the different courses we have on offer. Looking forward to seeing you all there.

On the 5th of February we hold our second Year 11 parents evening. We hold two Year 11 parents' evenings a year as strong communications between teachers and parents/carers is a key element in supporting Year 11 students through the final stages of GCSE's. Year 11 students have their second round of Mock exams at the beginning of March, it is vital students prepare for these exams by revising regularly and try their best to achieve the highest grade possible. Teachers will use the results of the mocks to tailor revision and support depending on their analysis of the results of each question examined.

Recently I counted how many teaching weeks we have remaining before the exam season officially starts - we have 9 weeks left! Time really is going very quickly; staff are now starting to set regular revision tasks for students to complete at home.



Please ask your child to come to Reception to claim any items that may be theirs.





REMINDER: Core Subject Homework Support


