

We want to make you aware of the following information about online safety and things to look out for that your children may be subject to online:

Platforms Specifically Used For promoting/supply for all substances



- Snapchat: Most commonly used for advertising opportunities due to its disappearing messages and popularity with young people.
- Instagram: Used to post glamorous images, stories, and coded adverts to attract attention.
- Facebook and WhatsApp: Utilised for messaging and group communication, though less frequently than Snapchat and Instagram.
- Telegram: used for encrypted conversations once initial contact is made. Large drug chat rooms that normalise use and 'genuine' feel , on line shops and ranking
- Signal – similar to telegram with encrypted messages
- TikTok: Young people have even advertised themselves as available to work on TikTok, though it is less commonly cited than Snapchat or Instagram.
- Online gaming platforms: Private chats and forums in games are exploited to befriend and groom young people who might not be active on social media




Each session will create a safe supportive space where parents and carers can engage in a way that feels comfortable for them, including anonymous contributions and end-of-session questions.
