To support this, we offer optional Castle Citizen Homework Projects each term — fun, creative activities that families can choose to enjoy together at home.

Science	As scientists, we are learning about the human body, exploring the major organs and

History	As historians, we are exploring the civilisation of Baghdad AD900, learning how it

Geography	As geographers, we are developing our spatial sense by studying maps, atlases and
	globes. We are learning how to use grid references, scales and symbols to explore

	ways. We are experimenting with a variety of techniques and creating our own pieces
	inspired by different artistic styles.
