We celebrate our rich local heritage through themes like "We are Conisbrough!" which connect learning to real experiences in our community. To support this, we offer optional Castle Citizen Homework Projects each term — fun, creative activities that families can choose to enjoy together at home.

English	As readers and writers, we are exploring texts such as Peace on Earth, Can We Save the
	Tiger? and The Hidden Forest. We are developing our ability to write persuasively, use
	ambitious vocabulary, and structure our ideas clearly in different types of writing.
Maths	As mathematicians, we are building fluency with integers and decimals and applying
	our knowledge to solve calculation problems. We are also developing our
	understanding of fractions and using reasoning to explain our thinking.
Science	As scientists, we are learning about the human body, exploring the circulatory system
	and how our organs function together. We are also beginning to understand the
	importance of healthy lifestyles and how they affect our long-term wellbeing.
History	As historians, we are learning about World War I and how it affected the lives of soldiers
riistory	and civilians. We are exploring key events, including the causes of the war, life in the
	trenches and the impact of remembrance today.
	Geography → As geographers, we are developing our spatial sense, using maps, atlases
Geography	and digital tools to understand places in the world. We are learning how physical
	features, such as rivers and landforms, shape communities and influence how people live.
Art	As artists, we are exploring Italian Renaissance art and learning how artists used
	proportion, perspective and symbolism. We are experimenting with these techniques in
	our own drawings and paintings.
Design &	As designers, we are focusing on structures and engineering, creating models inspired
Technology	by mining equipment such as mine shafts. We are learning how to plan, build and test
	strong, stable designs.
Maria	As musicians, we are learning songs from the Happy unit, exploring how music can
Music	express mood and emotion. We are performing both individually and as a group,
	developing our rhythm, confidence and control.
	As computer users, we are learning how to communicate effectively using the internet.
Computing	We are beginning to design and create webpages, thinking carefully about content and

	As thinkers, we are asking the question, "What would Jesus do?" and exploring how

	what influences our own choices and values.
