Select the themes listed below that link with the A Level course/s you will be studying in Year 12. Use the website 'Pinterest' to create a collection of images from the internet that inspire you. You will be using these images for Image Analysis tasks at the start of Year 12. These collections will also inform the Skills Building work that you will start in September.

Create separate Pinterest boards for each of the four themes.

### Fine Art:

1. Environments (Architecture)
2. Organic (Nature)
3. Organic (Human)
4. Organic (Decay)

### Photography:

1. Portrait
2. Landscape
3. Documentary
4. Abstract

## Visual Arts Task 2:

Visit a local gallery, museum or artist studio and write a review of the exhibition of creative work that you have seen. **You must see the work 'in the flesh' and not just viewed on line.** The work could be drawing, painting, sculpture, printmaking, graphic design or photography. Your review should be 500 words long and include images of the work you are analysing. This could be reproductions of the work on postcards or exhibition flyers, your own photographs of the work (where this is permitted by the gallery) or images researched from the internet.

Your written review should include information about the artist:

Who?	Name of the artist
When?	The dates of the artist
Where?	The country where the artist lives and/or works
What?	The genre or style of work that the artists creates
How?	The materials and techniques that they use
Why?	What is the message or meaning behind the work? What does the artist say?

Analyse one of the images you have seen, commenting on:

- The content or subject matter of the work
- Formal Elements (line, shape, tone, colour, texture, form)
- Composition or structure of the piece
- The mood or message of the work

### Visual Arts Task 3:

Create a dairy / journal about your summer.

This could be in the form of an A5 sketchbook.

Document:

- Everyday objects
- A journey
- Events
- Celebrations with friends & family
- Who you visited.
- A place you visited.
- A walk.

These could be realistic or abstract representations.

Be creative with the materials you use:

- Collage,
- Pen & Wash,
- Watercolour
- Oil Pastel,
- Chalk,
- Graphite pencil,

- Photography

Consider the angle you use:

- Close up
- Long distance
- Slanted angle
- Eye Level
- Bird's eye view
- Worm's eye view
