





<p>Reading Vipers</p> <p>Vocabulary Infer Predict Explain Retrieve Sequence or Summarise</p>  <p>Each week we will study an extract from a well-known book working on key reading skills.</p> <p>Our book this half term is “<i>Suffragette: The Battle for Equality</i>” by David Roberts. We will be writing a speech, with opportunities for drama activities and writing a formal letter to inform.</p>  <p>Support at home by: Every child will have their own reading book to read at home. Please ensure that children are reading every day and talk to them about what they have read. Children need to complete their reading record and bring this in every day.</p>	<p>This half term we will be learning about:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Coordinates in all four quadrants Translation and reflection Calculating intervals across zero as a context for negative numbers Converting between metric units of length, mass and capacity and units of time Know and use approximate conversion between imperial and metric <p>Support at home by:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Accessing Sumsdog to complete maths questions. Please encourage your child to spend at least 20 minutes every week on this. Ensuring all homework set is complete and handed-in on time (set on Friday, due by Wednesday). 	<p>In Science, we will continue learning about materials and we will explore:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> How materials are grouped based on their properties. What thermal conductivity is. Different methods of separating mixtures. How a solution is formed. Reversible and irreversible changes.  <p>Computing</p> <p>We will explore the concept of variables in programming through games in Scratch. They will find out what variables are and relate them to real-world examples of values that can be set and changed, and we will experiment with variables. We will continue to discuss with children how to stay safe online. We will explore the physical geography of New Zealand and learn about the Māori.</p>  <p>In History, we will learn about the Industrial Revolution. We will cover the impact this had on the lives of both the rich and the poor.</p>  <p>In R.E., we will be looking at the question ‘Why do Christians believe that Jesus was the Messiah?’</p>	<p>In art, we will be looking at print making. There will be a focus on different printmaking processes, specifically looking at Andy Warhol and screen printing.</p> 	<p>This half term Miss Woodcock’s class will be focusing on basketball and cricket. Miss Poppleton’s class will focus on dance and cricket.</p>  <p>We will continue to do outdoor PE even when the weather is cold. Please ensure your child has warm clothing for this.</p> <p>It is important that children come to school with an appropriate school P.E. kit and avoid wearing jewellery on the days they are doing P.E.</p>
