




<p>Reading Vipers</p> <p>Vocabulary Infer Predict Explain Retrieve Sequence or Summarise</p>  <p>Each week we will study an extract from a well-known book working on key reading skills.</p> <p>This half term we will continue to focus on “Percy Jackson and the lightning thief” by Rick Riordan. We will be writing a Character and setting description, a diary entry with opportunities for drama activities and writing an adventure narrative.</p>  <p>Support at home by: Every child will have their own reading book to read at home. Please ensure that children are reading every day and talk to them about what they have read. Children need to complete their reading record and bring this in every day.</p>	<p>This half term we will be learning about:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Coordinates in all four quadrants • Translation and reflection • Calculating intervals across zero as a context for negative numbers • Converting between metric units of length, mass and capacity and units of time • Know and use approximate conversion between imperial and metric <p>Support at home by:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Accessing Sumsdog to complete maths questions. Please encourage your child to spend at least 20 minutes every week on this. • Ensuring all homework set is complete and handed in on time (set on Friday, due by Wednesday). 	<p>In Science, we will be learning about the human body and we will explore:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Identify and name the main parts of the human circulatory system. • Describe the functions of the heart, blood vessels and blood. • Describe the ways in which nutrients and water are transported within animals, including humans.

		<p>We will explore the concept of variables in programming through games in Scratch. They will find out what variables are and relate them to real-world examples of values that can be set and changed, and we will experiment with variables. We will continue to discuss with children how to stay safe online. We will look at maps of the local area, will sketch maps using their knowledge of the local area and will collect and analyse data.</p> <p>In History, we will learn about World War I. We will cover the causes of the war, life during the war and its impact.</p>  <p>In R.E., we will be looking at the question ‘How can following God bring freedom and justice?’</p>	<p>In art, we will explore mythical creatures through sculpture using clay, papier mâché, and recycled materials. Inspired by creatures from Greek mythology and Percy Jackson, we will develop practical sculpture techniques, artist research skills, and imaginative design ideas before creating a final 3D artwork.</p>	<p>This half term we will be focusing on dodgeball and rounders.</p>  <p>It is important that children come to school with an appropriate school P.E. kit and avoid wearing jewellery on the days they are doing P.E.</p>
