PSHE and RE content Autumn term:

Our PSHE curriculum intends to allow students to reflect on and clarify their own values and attitudes as well as explore complex and sometimes conflicting values and attitudes they might encounter now and in the future.



Key stage 3 and 4 students have been covering the following content in their PSHE lessons in this term:

Managing change: transition to secondary school, managing emotions and personal safety in and outside of school.

Building healthy relationships: Healthy friendships and romantic relationships (including online). Boundaries and consent.

Substance misuse & exploitation: Vaping, smoking, alcohol, counter/ prescription drugs, illegal drugs inc. law & cannabis Exploitation & county lines.

Identity & relationships: Protected characteristics & sexual orientation. Impact of homophobic bullying. Stereotypes, sexting and consent.

Peer influence, substance use & gangs: Healthy and unhealthy friendships, risky behaviours (ASB), substance misuse & gang exploitation.

Respectful relationships: Different families & different long-term commitments e.g. marriage, civil partnerships, Legal rights in relationships. Abusive relationships.

Respectful Britain: Being British, Equality Act and promoting tolerance. Gangs, hate crime, challenging extremism and radicalisation.

Securing a job: Applying for a job, interview techniques, action planning for the future.

Building for the future: Career planning with Morrisby, Self-efficacy, stress management, mental health and future opportunities

Post 16 transitions: Writing CVs, different types of employment and apprenticeships.

In the Spring term, the following topics will be covered in PSHE:

Year 7: Health & puberty and Diversity and equality

Year 8: Emotional & physical health and Labour market information

Year 9: Opportunity awareness and Intimate relationships

Year 10: Mental Health and Healthy relationships

Year 11: Self-examination & sexual health and Families and relationships



PSHE and RE content Autumn term:

At Netherwood Academy we believe in the importance of teaching students about religion, but also helping them to explore & analyse own beliefs, values & ethics. Therefore we follow "worldviews" approach, guided by Ofsted's RE Review (2021).

Key stage 3 and 4 students have been covering the following content in their RE lessons in this term:

- What do the Abrahamic Faith stories believe about God?
- What does it mean to be good?
- What is the love of Wisdom?
- What is the most useful approach to take when making medical ethical decisions?
- Sexuality, Relationships and Family



- Why are religions so diverse?
- Why is Christianity the way it is?
- How did Islam begin and develop? What are the challenges of being Muslim is 21st century Britain? Are religious views on crime and punishment reflected in modern day society?

Form time curriculum:

Our Form curriculum is planned to contribute to and reinforce the PSHE curriculum and the character education assembly programme. During Form time, students will develop knowledge in key areas and develop communication, oracy and debate skills, through applying their knowledge and understanding in the following themes, and discuss how they would respond to social and moral dilemmas within these themes:

Year 7: Challenges for starting a new school, Building effective friendships, Dealing with change and conflict, accessing support, Learning from setbacks and challenges, Road and bus safety, Healthy and unhealthy relationships, Online safety and grooming, Bullying and its impact, Online relationships, consent, coercion, manipulation, Consent and Communicating consent and where to get support.

Year 8: Vaping and smoking, Alcohol, Counter medications and prescription drugs, Illegal drugs and cannabis, County lines, Communicating personal values in different relationships, Conflict in relationships, Expectations of romantic relationships, Sexual orientation, Consent

Communicating consent and where to get support, Consent, misconceptions and myths.

Year 9: Peer pressure, Risky behaviour, Impact of gangs, Gun and knife crime and gangs, Personal safety, Anti-social behaviour, Different family units, Commitment in relationships Communicating personal values in different relationships, Ending relationships and legal rights, Expectations of romantic relationships, Unhealthy and exploitive relationships, relationship abuse.

CAREERS INFORMATION ADVICE AND GUIDANCE:

The evening was a huge success and developed parent's and student's knowledge on the various Post-16 and Post-18 pathways and how to prepare for life after GCSE examinations.

In October, Netherwood hosted a very successful Post-16 options fair for students in Years 8-11.

Over 20 external organisations attended the event, to provide our students with advice and guidance in relation to their potential progression routes.

Students found the day extremely insightful and behaved impeccably throughout, with the external organisations commenting on how successful the day was.




REWARDS AT NETHERWOOD:
