Charity day



Celebrations!

There have been lots of reasons to celebrate student success, in many different ways, over the last week and a bit. Here's an overview of all the positivity shared:

Principal Commendations

We were delighted to celebrate the Principal Commendations last week. This award sees two students nominated by their tutors, recognising many of the following elements: attitude to learning, kindness, progress, for representing the school, being a wonderful ambassador to the tutor group or school and numbers of house points to name but a few. Year 7, 8 and 9 have received their commendations, Year 10 will get theirs when we return (delayed due to Work Experience and the Iceland trip).







Zero heroes

On Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday this week we brought together the "Zero heroes" in years 7-10 from the last half term to congratulate them on being so amazing. These are the students who received two or fewer negative points over the course of the term – the students who almost always get it right, and very rarely get anything wrong, day in, day out. We don't insist on exactly zero negatives, as we not insisting on perfection for everything – even the best students are human, and can make the odd mistake.

Students received a certificate to take home, a doughnut (or other allergy-free alternative) and a badge to recognise their success. It was brilliant to see how packed the canteen was from each year group:

- Year 7: 195 students
- Year 8: 231 students
- Year 9: 200 students
- Year 10: 194 students

Students who achieved the award for second time this year received a silver Zero Hero badge, whilst those who attend for the first time received a Bronze badge. In addition, 294 students have gone all year without any negatives: 73 in Year 7, 83 in Year 8, 66 in Year 9 and 72 in Year 10. Well done to all of these fabulous young people.

Celebration assembly

This week has also seen the return this year of the Certificate of Excellence subject awards in the final celebration assembly. Teachers were asked to nominate students from their subjects who have demonstrated excellence in their subject, and students were able to be nominated for as many subjects as appropriate – a few students had nine subject nominations! In addition to the subject awards, the assemblies were a brilliant opportunity for students to look back on their year, remembering the events they have undertaken. Finally, we awarded certificates and badges for students achieving house point badges – for example the student below who has achieved the gold badge this year for over 500 house points.





Golden ticket

Today we have also undertaken our final Golden Ticket draw for the year; students have the opportunity when they earn a golden ticket to place it into a draw at the end of each half term.

Winners receive a £20 Amazon voucher to recognise their efforts and attitude to learning.

Consultation details

Face-to-face parents' evenings

Linked below are the full details submitted for the face-to-face parents' evening consultation. The numbers will be slightly different to those reported last week, as I have chosen to include late submissions to give a fuller picture, but the overall pattern is still the same – continue with the trial, and continue with the four-minute meeting slots.

I think the question about why were are only trialling this next year is a really important one. It is clear from your feedback that parents and carers value the opportunity to build relationships with staff in a more personal way by talking face-to-face, but due to the possibly logistical issues a return to face-to-face parents' evenings not necessarily welcomed by everyone, and there are legitimate concerns (some of which were also shared by staff in their consultation) which will need to be successfully addressed before a further rollout can be considered.

Whilst I was slightly surprised by the preference for the trial starting with Year 7 (I suggested Year 8, and the PAC suggested Year 9 then 10), we will honour the feedback from the wider parent/ carer voice and trial with the new Year 7 students first next year.

Year 11 Period 6 interventions

Whilst we will still be going ahead with the Year 11 Period 6 interventions next year on a Voluntary/ Targeted (home and school in agreement) basis, we will be delaying its introduction for the first three weeks to enable us to properly address all of the queries raised, and properly brief staff on this new initiative following on from the collation of the Year 10 mock results earlier this week. We will publish the full consultation details at the start of September, with the full implementation plan, when we are ready to proceed.

September return

Finally, a note about the arrangements for the start of next term:

- Year 7 will start at 8.30am on Tuesday 2 September 2025, and should meet on the basketball courts.
- Year 12 will start at 8.30am on Tuesday 2 September 2025, meeting in the common room for assembly and signing on. Once the signing on process has completed (around 10am), students will not be required in school until Wednesday 3 September 2025.

• All other year groups start at 8.30am on Thursday 4 September 2025. Students should go straight to morning welcome: Year 8 (between craft and science blocks), Year 9 (Resource Centre playground), Year 10 and Year 11 (basketball courts) and Year 13 (common room).
