
Red (danger zone)-below 90% = Persistent Absentee



Healthy Eating

Writing in school

- Children will write various pieces of fiction and non-fiction throughout the year. All writing will be inspired by a high-quality text and we give children plenty of opportunities to develop their ideas through drama, role play and visitors to the school.
- Reading is breathing in and writing is breathing out!
- For handwriting, we aim to regularly practice each week with children being given prescribed formats and content to follow.
- Children have previously learnt many of the letter and number formations and we will continue this work.

What is Renaissance Accelerated Reader (AR)?


- AR helps teachers support and monitor children's reading practice.
- Your child picks a book at their own level
- When finished, your child takes a short online quiz

How can I help my child become a better reader?

- Make time for them to read at home. Children need to read for at least 20 minutes every day to improve their reading ability.
- Encourage your child to read; discuss books, asking questions about what they have read; and visit your local library.

Maths in school

- We use an array of resources including those provided from the National Centre for Excellence in the Teaching of Mathematics mastery materials, with which we use to support the teaching of the Mathematics curriculum, offering an array of learning challenges to all pupils..
- We use lots of resources to help with our learning such as diennes, place value counters and Numicon.



Timestable Rockstars

- A lot of the Year 5 and 6 Maths curriculum is based in the understanding of number. Part of that understanding is rooted in a quick and secure understanding of our timestables.
- The more facts your child remembers, the easier it is for them to do harder calculations.

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

- Minimise screen time where you can.








Mobile Phones (KS2)
