Uniform: Trainers must be all black if worn as school shoes.






# **Internet Safety:**

# Lessons, kit etc

<u>PE</u> - PE kit should be brought in on the days set. All jewellery must be removed- we do not tape up ear-piercings. Please do not dress children in their PE kit for school. They must get changed at school.

# Reading books-

Reading books are changed when needed. Children will need a bag to take their reading book home. Book bags can be bought at the office. Please read with your child every day and sign their reading record.

# Food, allergies and medical information

## **Healthy Eating**

Your child can be provided with milk to drink at break times. This can be arranged with the school office. A list of suggested items for packed lunches can be found at the school office.

### Water

Please ensure your child brings in a <u>named</u> bottle of water for use in the classroom.

# Allergies

Please make staff (office & class teacher) aware if your child has or develops an allergy to any food which may be served at school. You must keep this information up to date at all times.

### Medication

Inhalers, Epi-Pens and any other important medication must be labelled clearly (pharmacy label), in date and a consent form signed.

# Reading in Year 3 and Year 4

- Children are allocated a book which is matched to their ability. Some children will be given a book to practise their sounds. They move up book bands when they are able to read most words in books of that level but also have a good understanding of what they have read. We will also continue to work on word sets with children.
- Children will read aloud to an adult. They will listen to every child read each week.
- We also use shared reading approaches to support comprehension.

# **Accelerated Reader**

This is a computer-based program which is used alongside other reading tools. This checks that children understand what they are reading.

Children must complete a book quiz every time they finish reading a book. If they pass the quiz, then they can change their book.

There are a range of books in each level. Children are able to choose any book within their band. Some will be easier and read for pleasure and others will challenge the children more. Whichever choice they make they must still complete a quiz.

It is extremely important that we work together to help your child read. Please read at home every day.

# Writing in school

- Children will write various pieces of fiction and non-fiction throughout the year. All writing will be inspired by a high-quality text and we give children plenty of opportunities to develop their ideas through drama, role play and visitors to the school.
- Reading is breathing in and writing is breathing out!
- For handwriting, we follow the Dyslexic Cursive scheme.
- Children have previously learnt many of the letter and number formations and we will continue this work.

# Maths in school

 We use the National Centre for Excellence in the Teaching of Mathematics mastery materials to support the teaching of the Mathematics curriculum.

 We use lots of resources to help with our learning such as Diennes, place value counters and Numicon.

# **Multiplication check**

Year 4 children also take a multiplication test at the end of the year. Please help your child practise their times tables.



### Multiplication tables check

Schools should administer the multiplication tables check within the 2-week period from Monday 2nd June 2025.

# How to support your child

Ensure your child has the best possible attendance at school and is at school on time.

Hear your child read daily and write what they have read in their reading record.

Practise times tables with your child.

Talk to your child about what they have learnt at school and what books they are reading.

Make sure our child has a good sleep each night and a healthy breakfast every morning.

Make sure your child has all the equipment they need for school that day – coat, bag, packed lunch (if needed) and a water bottle.

# Mobile Phones (KS2)

If your child <u>needs</u> to bring a phone to school, they are not to be used for entertainment/ take photos on the playground before and after school.

Phones must be handed in to the office during registration and collected at the end of the day.

Any reported incidents of misuse of mobile phones (either in or out of school) will result in a parental meeting to discuss the suitability of your child bringing a device to school.
