How to support your child

Ensure your child has the best possible attendance at school and is at school on time.

Support your child with any homework tasks and hear your child read daily.

Practise number bonds to 10 with your child (Y1) and counting in 2s, 5s and 10s (Y2).

Talk to your child about what they have learnt at school and what books they are reading.

Make sure our child has a good sleep each night and a healthy breakfast every morning.

Reading in school

• Children will begin to take part in shared reading where they will read aloud in small

groups. Teachers will listen to every child read each week.

- Children move up book bands when they are able to read most words in books of that level but also have a good understanding of what they have read.
 - <u>Please read with your child regularly at home and, where possible, write a short</u> <u>comment or sign their reading records.</u>

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Children must bring their book bags to school each day.

Writing in school

- Children will write various pieces of fiction and non-fiction throughout the year. All writing will be inspired by a high-quality text and we give children plenty of opportunities to develop their ideas through drama, role play and visitors to the school.
 - We follow Kinetic Letters as our handwriting scheme. Children have previously learnt many of the letter and number formations and we will continue this work. In Year 1 we begin cursive writing, this will help to increase the flow of your child's writing.

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Maths in school

Each year we begin by ensuring children are confident with the skills from the previous year and build on this knowledge. We use lots of resources to help with our practical learning such as Diennes, place value counters and Numicon.



Phonics Screening

The children will have to take part in the check in the May. The checks will be administered on a 1:1 basis with an adult that children are familiar with.

The child will be required to read 40 words which they can sound out. The pass mark is usually 32/40 words read correctly.

We continue learning phonics in Year 2. You can support your child be ensuring you hear them read on a daily basis.

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Break times
