In the Street

- Recognising bus numbers
- Number plate hunt. e.g. Who can find a
 7? Add the numbers up
- Comparing door numbers odd and even numbers
- Counting how many lampposts on the way to school?

Doing the Washing

- Counting in 2's matching shoes, socks
- Sorting by colour and size
- Matching/pairing up socks
- Does your child understand the meaning of 'one pair'?
- Find four shoes that are different sizes. Can you put them in order?
- Can your child describe the lengths using: longest / longer / shorter / shortest?

Time

Learn by Rote

- The days of the week (lots of songs on Youtube)
- Understand and use words: yesterday, today, tomorrow, weekend, fortnight
- Know time facts
- How many hours in one day? How many minutes in one hour? How many seconds in one minute? How many months in a year? How many days in a year?
- Months of the year (lots of songs on Youtube)
- > Learn your date of birth.





- Wearing a watch with pointers.
- Recognising numbers on the clock. If you cover a number, what number was missing?
- Learning to read: o'clock, ½ past, ¼ past, ¼ to and then...
- Learning to count steps of in five.
- Learning to read time in five minute intervals 'past' the hour
- Learning to read time in five minute intervals 'to' the hour
- Use timers, phones and clocks to measure short periods of time
- Count down 10/20 seconds to get to the table/into bed etc.



Food!

- Setting the table. Counting the right number of plates etc.
 How many more do we need?
- <u>Halving / halved</u> Can you cut your toast into 2 equal pieces? Can you cut it into 2 equal triangles?
- Can your child recognise ½ 2/2?
- Quartering / quartered Can you cut your toast / cakes / pizza into 4 equal pieces?

Can your child recognise 1/4 2/4 3/4 4/4?

- Can you make shapes/ patterns out of the knives and forks. Can you put them in the right place in the drawers?
- Helping with the cooking by measuring and counting ingredients.
- Setting the timer.
- Positional language at dinner time learning to hold a knife and fork in the correct hand – left / right?

Going Shopping

- Counting items into the basket
- Reading price tags
- Finding and counting coins
- Comparing weights which is heavier / heaviest / lighter / lightest?





Measuring

- Are you taller than a ...?
- Marking height on the wall.
- Cut hand shapes out of paper. How many hands long is the couch? How long is the table?
 Which is longer / longest / shorter / shortest?
- Who has the **biggest** hands in our family?
- How many steps from the gate to the front door?

Shapes

- Cut a potato into shapes (circles, triangle etc). Use with paint to make pictures and patterns.
- Cut out shapes from coloured paper/ newspaper and arrange into pictures.
- 2D Shape hunt: In your house or outside, can you find: a square, circle, oval, triangle, hexagon, pentagon?
- 3D Shape hunt: In your house or outside, a cube, cuboid, sphere, cone, square based pyramid, triangular based prism?
- Practice wrapping up presents describe the 2D shapes found on 3D shapes.

Playdough

Here's a simple recipe:

1 cup of plain flour
1 cup of water
1 tablespoon cooking oil
2 teaspoons cream of tartar
Half a cup of salt
food colouring and essences (optional)



Put all ingredients in a large saucepan, and heat slowly, stirring all the time until it forms a ball. Keep it wrapped in clingfilm or in a covered tub to stop it drying out.

Then

- Make numerals and shapes
- Sort shapes into groups, or order by size
- Make long and short wiggly snakes.
- Practise halving and quartering

Games

- Putting cards into piles
- Jigsaws (you can make your own by cutting up a magazine picture)
- Snap (matching pairs) or Happy Families (collect 4 of a kind)





- Snakes and Ladders or even better make your own 100 square and play Snakes and Ladders
- Any board game to practise counting on
- Adding numbers on two dice.
- Bingo, with numbers or shapes
- Dominoes

Number Rhymes and Songs

For example:

5 little monkeys jumping on the bed One fell off and bumped his head Mummy called the doctor and the doctor said "No more monkeys jumping on the bed!" 4 little monkeys jumping on the bed ...
