We would like to welcome you and your child to our learning community. Chiltern Primary School is a successful school serving the Hessle Road Area of the city. We are a larger than average Primary School.

Morning session x5 8:30am – 11:30 noon Afternoon session x5 12:00 noon – 3:00pm (A few places are sometimes available for those parents who are entitled to an additional 15 hours of free child care, there is a small charge for lunch time care)

Foundation Stage 2 and the Main School (children in full-time education)

Full-day session 8.55am - 3.00pm

The Foundation Stage

The school provides 60 full-time (F2) places for 4 & 5 year olds and 78 part-time (F1) places for 3 & 4 year olds. In Foundation 1, your child is entitled to 15 hours a week free education. Your child can come for either 5 mornings or 5 afternoons. A few places are sometimes available for those parents who are entitled to an additional 15 hours of free child care, there is a small charge for lunch time care and the sessions are 8.30am-3.00pm.

Each term, we will assume that you wish for your child to continue with the same sessions they attended during the previous term (either AM or PM). If you are interested in changing the sessions, you must contact the school office. Every effort is made to give you your chosen sessions though, when the class is full, priority is given to giving each child their 15 hour entitlement, which will be in the form of 5 morning or 5 afternoon sessions.

Breakfast Club

A free Breakfast Club is available for all children from Foundation 2. It starts at 8:00am every day.

A healthy breakfast is available and the children are supervised by our Breakfast Club, until they are taken to their classes for the start of the school day.

The Foundation Stage

The school provides 30 full-time (F2) places for 4 & 5 year olds and 52 part-time (F1) places for 3 & 4 year olds. Part-time places are offered at 15 hours per week and can be accessed as all mornings, all afternoons or a split week (Mon, Tues, Wed A.M or Wed P.M, Thurs, Fri.)

The children in F1 & F2 follow the Early Years Foundation Stage guidance, specifically designed for children in their early years of education. A secure, safe and happy childhood provides the foundation for children to make the most of their abilities and talents as they grow and develop. At St George's, our provision, our expertise and our caring staff will help your child thrive and reach their full potential in a safe environment. We are committed to helping your child become lifelong independent learners. We provide each child with rich, fun and personalised learning experiences to give them the best start in school.

Each class is supported by a teacher and a teaching assistant. Parental involvement is encouraged through reading and writing sessions and termly activity days. Part-time and full-time children participate in educational visits outside of the classroom. Part-time and full-time children also take part in NAPA (Northern Academy of Performing Arts) shows twice a year.

Breakfast Club

A free Breakfast Club is available for children from Foundation 2. It starts at 8:00am every day. A healthy breakfast is available and the children are supervised by our Breakfast Club, until they are taken to their classes for the start of the school day. There is no cost for the

breakfast club.

The school provides 60 full-time (F2) places for 4 & 5 year olds and 52 part-time (F1) places for 3 & 4 year olds. Part-time places are offered at 15 hours per week and can be accessed as all mornings, all afternoons or two and a half days.

The children in F1 & F2 follow the Early Years Foundation stage guidance, specifically designed for children in their early years of education. They are taught through play and their activities are based around first-hand experiences and experiential learning. They are encouraged to be enquiring, inquisitive and independent learners. Children are taught in mixed classes to support and promote peer learning. Our F2 classes each have 30 children and our F1 classes each have 13 morning children and 13 afternoon children. All classes are supported by a teacher and a minimum of one teaching assistant. Parental involvement is encouraged with daily Key skills sessions and an open-door policy at the beginning and end of all sessions.

After School Clubs

A small number of After School Clubs (finishing at 16.30pm) are provided for pupils in F2. The school does not charge for clubs but spaces are limited and cannot be guaranteed. The school sends letters to parents when new clubs are starting. Parents then apply for a place for their child and are provided further information if a place has been allocated.

Breakfast Club

Breakfast Club is available to our F2 children from 8:00am every morning. Admittance is from 8:00am until 8:20am. A balanced breakfast of cereal and toast is available and the children are supervised by our Breakfast Club team until they are taken to their classes for the start of the school day. Our Breakfast Club is currently free of charge.

Afternoon session 1pm – 4:00pm We also offer flexible sessions to suit both the needs of the parents where possible. Children wishing to access Adelaide nursery for 15hours education and 15hours at Octagon.

We will offer a pick up service via a "walking bus" from Adelaide nursery at 11.45am to Octagon. This will be at a cost of £5 per day and includes 1hour 15min of care and lunch. The afternoon session will then start at 1pm to 4pm. Parents are also welcome to bring their child to us for 1pm at no extra cost.

Options to purchase extra hours upto 6pm are also available at a cost of £5 per hour

The nursery provides 63 full-time places for under 5's . Places are offered for children accessing 15 hours per week free education and two year old funding , these can be accessed as all mornings, all afternoons or mixed sessions. We also offer full day care from 730am to 6pm term time only. We follow the Early Years Foundation stage guidance, specifically designed for children in their early years of education. They are taught through play and their activities are based around first-hand experiences and experiential learning. They are encouraged to be enquiring, inquisitive and independent learners. Parental involvement is encouraged with preschool children taking reading books home and writing activities.

What are we are about?

Children's Centres are a place where families can access all the quality services necessary to give their children the best start in life.

This is likely to include information, training, childcare and an outreach

service which will be delivered by professionals from different backgrounds working together to support you.

Need a little extra help and support?

If you feel you need a little extra help, we can also offer practical and emotional support for families on a one-to-one basis. We can help with information on child development, Isolation, Parenting skills, housing issues, training and volunteering 2 year funding etc. Call your local centre for more information or to speak to a family support team member.

Fenchurch Cluster Children Centres

Fenchurch Cluster consists of Octagon, Marvell and Fenchurch Children Centres and are located within the perimeters of Hull City Centre covering five wards, Myton, St Andrews, Avenue, Newland and Bicknell. The following services are available

- Hey Baby Antenatal classes
- Doula/Breastfeeding Support
- Family Support
- Child Health Clinics
- Training Courses/ Volunteering Opportunity's

- Positive parenting programmes

Goodwin Development Trust -is commissioned to deliver Children Centre services in the Wyke and Riverside area, There are a range of other projects that add value to our services offering an holistic model of support for families. Services include

Doula Project, Doulas offer one-to-one practical and emotional support from about 28 weeks of pregnancy but it can be earlier.

Breastfeeding Peer Support, BFPS give accredited training to female volunteers (who have breastfed their own babies) giving them the skills to provide support and information to other mothers in Hull.

Haven Project, The Haven Project gives psychological support to refugees and asylum seekers in Hull. We specialise in working with black and minority ethnic (BME) families with children and teenagers.

Fareshare Hull & Humber is a volunteer led service that is part of the national Fareshare network and provide food resources to the Children Centres for distribution to families in need.

Goodwin Community Housing, Goodwin Development Trust has launched the Goodwin Community Housing programme to provide excellent quality housing at 80% of current market rental rates as well as access to all of Goodwin's Family of Services.

Goodwin Youth Services which runs the Youth Centre at Darleys for 8—19 year olds & Goodwin Café - inside the Octagon Building.

Goodwin YEI Project -A key worker can help meet your personal, social, educational and employment goals and identify and overcome any barriers that you may face in life such as financial mental health and Housing issues.

Each key worker will work with you for 12 months and would maintain contact for a further 6 months Contact 01482 485958 for more information

The children in F1 & F2 follow the Early Years Foundation stage guidance, specifically designed for children in their early years of education. They are taught through play and their activities are based around first-hand experiences and experiential learning. They are encouraged to be enquiring, inquisitive and independent learners. The F2 & F1 children are taught in mixed classes to support independence and promote peer learning. Each class is supported by a teacher and a minimum of two teaching assistants. Parental involvement is encouraged with daily reading and writing sessions and termly activity days. Part-time and full-time children participate in education visits outside of the classroom. Part-time and full-time children take part in performances to parents at various times throughout the year.

After School Club

Our After School Club is available every day, 3pm – 6pm, for all families. The cost, per session is £6. To book your child into the After School Club, or for more information, please contact Mrs. Thomas, via the school office.

Breakfast Club

Breakfast Club is available to all children from 8:00am every morning. Admittance is from 8:00am until 8:15am. A balanced breakfast of cereal and toast is available and the children are supervised by our Breakfast Club team until they are taken to their classes for the start of the school day. The cost of our Breakfast Club is 50p, payable on a daily basis.
