

English Literature Components



Total exam time: 1 hour and 45 minutes Total exam time: 2 hours and 15 minutes

Literature Paper 1AB

Shakespeare and the 19th century novel 40%

Section A - Macbeth

Students given extract to answer 2 part question on either theme, character or setting. Students write about extract and the play as a whole

(34m=45-50mins)

Section B – A Christmas Carol

Students given extract to answer 2 part question on either theme, character or setting. Students write about extract and the novel as a whole

(30m=45-50mins)

Literature Paper 2ABC

Modern texts and Poetry 60%

Section A – Animal Farm

Students given option of 2 questions on their studied text: character, theme or setting (34m=45mins)

Section B – Power and Conflict Poetry Anthology


Students answer comparative question on a given poem **and** one of their choice, from the studied cluster

(30m=45mins)

Section C – Unseen Poetry

Students answer a question on an unseen poem, then compare with a second unseen (24m+8m=30mins+15mins)

English Language Components



Language Paper 1AB

Explorations in creative reading and writing 50% GCSE

Section A

Students given a 19th or 20th century literary extract to read 4 part response required:

- 1. List 4 things
- 2. How does the writer use language
- 3. How has the writer structured the text
- 4. Evaluate a part of the text

Section B

Students write descriptively or narratively (40m=55mins)

Language Paper 2AB

Writers viewpoints and perspectives 50% GCSE

Section A

Students are given 2 sources to read (19th and 20th or 21st C.)

4 part response required:

- 1. Identify 4 true statements
- 2. Summarise both sources
- 3. One source language focus
- 4. Comparing both sources

Section B

Students write to present a viewpoint (letter, speech, article, essay, text for a leaflet)
