







## Maths

#### What are they?

A seam is a line where two pieces of fabric are sewn together in a garment or other article.

A hem is the edge of a piece of cloth or clothing which has been turned under and sewn.

Appliqué is ornamental needlework in which pieces of fabric are sewn or stuck on to a larger piece to form a picture or pattern.

A seam allowance is the area between the edge and the stitching line on two (or more) pieces of material being stitched together.



#### Golden Rules

The seam allowance is 15mm

When stitching fabric together using a seam you put the right (nice) sides of the fabric together

When stitching a seam you always use a straight stitch (stitch 01)

The bobbin should travel in an anticlockwise direction and through the **thread guide** at 6 o'clock, then pulling round to 9 o'clock when threading the machine

#### 1.4 Making the business effective

#### 1) Liability

Liability: the legal responsibility the businesses owner has to pay its debts.

Limited Liability: There is a legal difference between the business and its owner

Unlimited Liability: There is no legal difference between the business and its owner

Unlimited Liability means the owners can lose their personal possessions if their business has debts. Limited liability reduces the risk as business debts will belong to the business, not the owner.

#### 4) Private Limited Companies

Shares in a private limited company can only be sold if all the shareholders agree, and the opportunity to buy shares is restricted, usually to relatives and friends. Private limited companies have Ltd after their name in the UK.

Limited companies have limited liability and a separate legal identity from their shareholders, this means that the company can buy assets, make contracts and take legal action against other businesses in its own name rather than that of its owners.

#### Advantages

- Easy to raise finance
- Limited liability
- Continues to trade if shareholders change •
- Customers trust a 'Ltd' more than other businesses

- Complex to set up

#### 2) Sole Traders

A sole trader describes any business that is owned and controlled by one person - although they may employ workers. Individuals who provide a specialist service like plumbers, hairdressers or photographers are often sole traders.

Sole traders do not have a separate legal existence from the business. In the eyes of the law, the business and the owner are the same. As a result, the owner is personally liable for the firm's debts and may have to pay for losses made by the business out of their own pocket. This is called unlimited liability.

#### 3) Partnerships

Partnerships are businesses owned by two or more

#### 5) Franchises

A franchisor grants a licence (the franchise) to another business (the franchisee) to allow it to trade using the brand or business format.

#### The franchisor helps with:

- Training staff
- Setting prices
  - Choosing suppliers
- Setting wages
- Determining uniform

- Brand image and reputation is already established

- Restrictions on where the franchise can be set up









## Homework

Every school day you should be completing 20 minutes of reading, 20 minutes of Maths and 20 minutes working on your knowledge organisers. You should be studying/making notes/self-testing on at least 1 Knowledge Organiser (KO) within that 20 minutes. You are to use your student diary to show the work you have done. You need to bring your KOs and student diary with you EVERY DAY to school.

Your parents should sign your student diary every week to say you have completed your homework.

Parents should also sign off your reading and maths using the reading /maths log page at the end of each week in your student diary. These will be checked by your tutor during Monday registrations each week.

You will also be tested in your lessons on knowledge from the organisers as part of the

'Do Nows' and other assessments.

## **Self-testing**

You can use your KOs and student diary in a number of different ways but you should not just copy from the Knowledge Organiser into your diary. Below are some possible tasks:

- Look, cover, write and check
- Ask someone to write questions for you
- Write your own challenging questions and then leave it overnight to answer them the next day
- Create mind-maps
- Create flashcards
- Put the key words into new sentences
- Mnemonics

- Draw a comic strip of a timeline
- Use the 'clock' template to divide the information into smaller sections. Then test yourself on different sections
- Give yourself spelling tests
- Definition tests
- Draw diagrams of processes
- Draw images and annotate/label them with extra information
- Do further research on the topic






