



ADT Blended Learning Plan 2020-2021

Art, RMT, Food, Graphics and Textiles

KS3 - Students will work on specific tasks set by the teacher that can be found on the Google Classroom or in a Shared Drive (this will have been communicated to the groups). Tasks will not always fall in line with what lessons are being taught on campus due to restrictions of equipment. Tasks will always meet National Curriculum Requirements. Students can submit work to their teacher via Google Classroom, emailing it to teachers or putting it on their Google Slides folders.

Art, Engineering, Hospitality, Graphics and Textiles

KS4 - Students will focus on coursework tasks or preparation for their exams (Engineering and Hospitality only). Coursework tasks will be set using the Google Classroom and work can be submitted by students on here, via email or in their Google Slide presentation folders. All resources to support students and their learning will be on shared Drives as well as in the classroom to help the students to progress. Appropriate tasks will be set for the students in relation to what equipment that they have at home. If a student does not have specific equipment, this must be made known to the teacher and appropriate tasks can be set (as everyone has different things at home).

Art, Design, Photography, Graphics and Textiles

KS5 - Students have access to the Google Classroom where Knowledge Organisers, written guide sheets as well as the year planners are kept to support students with their learning for the topic. Teachers will have the option to either run live lessons through Google Meets or record videos teaching the content. These videos will be posted on Google Classroom. Some students have Subject Improvement Plans and due to the nature of ADT courses, personal projects are very independent. Teachers will work with the students to continue to hit weekly targets for their coursework units of work. At A Level, coursework is very independent due to the nature of the units. Teachers will communicate with the students via email also so that discussions concerning the units of work can take place.
