- Poetry two collections: 'Poems of the Decade: An Anthology of the Forward Books of Poetry' and 'The Great Modern Poets.
- Drama 'Twelfth Night' by Shakespeare and 'The Duchess of Malfi' by John Webster.






## There are three exams:

- Prose is one (from a choice of two) comparison question: 1 hour 15 minutes.
- Poetry is one (from a choice of two) question on each collection: 2 hours 15 minutes.
- Drama is one (from a choice of two) question on each play: 2 hours 15 minutes.

For all exams you are allowed to have clean copies of the texts in the exam with you.
