LEBC Virtual Work Experience July 2021

As part of our evolving careers programme and school event calendar. We strive to provide the best opportunities for our students inside and outside of the classroom. Reflecting on the current situation and looking back over the last 12 months, we feel our Year 12 students will greatly benefit from an off-timetable week in which they gain various experiences and study skills. We have decided that the week commencing 5th July 2021 will be dedicated to this event, therefore although traditionally students would be at their work experiences, they will be on site this year. A further letter explaining the week and timetable of events will be sent out to you soon. All students are expected to attend for the full duration of the week unless they have already secured work experience and the necessary paperwork has been completed and given to the Post 16 Team.

This means there will be no time given to completing the LEBC virtual work experience which some of our students have signed up to. However, it doesn't mean they will miss out on the opportunity. I have liaised with LEBC to extend the period through which our students can access the materials. Our students will have access for 1 month in order to complete their work experience in their own time. The cost of the programme is £10. In the first module of the programme, the virtual team will run through a step by step of the programme; including how to navigate the portal, what sections are involved, the benefits of taking part and how young people can use the programme for their future. This will be presented in animated video format which will be eye catching to drive the excitement for the rest of the programme!

EMPLOYABILITY - CV

Creating a CV is such an important part of young people's transition into the working world and in this module, our qualified careers advisors will be explaining to students the importance of CV's and how the content and layout can be vital to progressing onto interview. There will be video content including how best to identify skills and qualities and top tips to make a CV stand out from the rest of the crowd.

STUDENT SECTOR

Students take full control in this module, choosing a sector that they are most interested in. We have some fantastic companies on board, who will give an insight into how businesses in that industry work. Video footage will include work place tours, interviews with employees giving insight into a real working day, what their responsibilities are and the best/most challenging parts of their job. There will also be some current local labour market information about their chosen sector.

HEALTH AND SAFETY

This module will focus on the importance of health and safety in the workplace and how we use it every day- most of the time without even realising! Qualified health and safety assessors will deliver information regarding different roles, how health and safety is used in different types of companies and the consequences of not taking it seriously! There will be interactive video content and a quiz at the end to recap and use the information they have previously learnt- including a special Health and Safety certificate to download at the end of the programme.

EMPLOYABILITY

In this exciting module, we've asked employee's from companies across Leicestershire to explain their recruitment and interview processes. Students will gain a better understanding of what employers look for in a potential employee, how they shortlist to interview and what style of interview they use. Students will also have chance to take part in interactive presentations which will give them the chance see some best practice and help overcome worries and concerns young people may have about interviews.

WORK EXPERIENCE

This is where students can gain experience solving a real-life business challenge, completing a task set by a local employer relating to their industry choice. Students will get the chance to use skills they have built on the programme, as well as build new transferrable skills such as team work, communication, problem solving and critical thinking. Students are encouraged to work in small groups to create a final project, with the opportunity for the employer to give constructive feedback to use in their career files in the future.
