## **Year 12 mock examinations 7th June - 11th June**

Your mock exams will run from 7th to 11th June. The majority of the exams will be held in the Brookvale Gym with some exceptions that are outlined on the timetable that we have attached for you. If you qualify for exam concessions then you will not be in the Gym and details of your exam room will follow shortly. If students have any queries about exam concessions they should talk to their subject teacher/Post 16 in the first instance.

Mock exams will be run over the 1-week period stated above and timetabled lessons will still run as usual. Your attendance and performance in mock exams is extremely important. You will be expected to attend all of your mocks and your lessons when you are not in an exam during the week. Results are used to assess current grades and may be used to support future UCAS predictions. These exams will allow us to monitor progress, ensuring the correct interventions and support are in place. As with any examinations, we expect students to treat these mocks as the real exams and revise well, have all the correct equipment with them and arrive at the exam location promptly to start the exam.

We have attached a copy of the exam timetable for your information and your subject teachers have also given a topic list per subject so you have an idea of what topics may be covered in the exams. If you have any further questions regarding individual subject exams or topics please speak to your subject teacher.
