I think there should be a greater focus on what other schools are doing to support HPA as well as some extra focus on disadvantaged HPA's and providing safe spaces for pastoral support as Kathryn mentioned that sometimes there was a dip in HPA progress due to the pressure put on them as well as the change in environment for those transitioning to secondary from primary.
